6	(1) If an individual who is a humane society police
7	officer fails to apply for inclusion in the registry as
8	prescribed in subsection (a), the individual's powers and
9	authority specified in section 3708 (relating to powers and
10	authority; jurisdiction) shall be immediately suspended until
11	such time as the individual successfully completes the
12	application for registration or renewal of registration. The
13	department shall notify the court of common pleas and
14	district attorney of each county to which the individual is
15	appointed as a humane society police officer of the
16	<u>suspension.</u>
17	(2) If an individual who is a humane society police
18	officer fails to renew within 30 days of the anniversary of
19	appointment, the department shall provide notice to the
20	individual that the individual has 90 days to complete the
21	renewal and mark the individual as suspended in the registry.
22	The department shall notify the court of common pleas and
23	district attorney of each county to which the individual is
24	appointed as a humane society police officer of the
25	suspension.

28	A society or association shall be subject to the act of
29	February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right to Know Law,
30	and considered to be a "local agency" under that act.
