AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, providing for the seizure of suspended registration
- 3 plates and registration cards and for seizure of revoked and
- suspended drivers' licenses.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Sections 1376 and 1540 of Title 75 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 9 § 1376. Surrender of registration plates and cards upon
- 10 suspension.
- 11 (a) General rule. -- The department, upon suspending any
- 12 registration, shall require the registration plate or plates and
- 13 registration card to be surrendered immediately to the
- 14 department and may delegate authority to any authorized
- 15 department employee[, member of the Pennsylvania State Police or
- 16 local police officer] or constable of the county or geographic
- 17 <u>area appropriate to the address indicated for the registration</u>
- 18 plates or card to seize the registration plate or plates and

- 1 registration card or cards. The department shall, by regulation,
- 2 prescribe the manner of selecting the employees and [State and
- 3 local police officers] constables to seize the registration
- 4 plates and registration cards.
- 5 (b) Penalty. -- Any person failing or refusing to surrender to
- 6 the department, upon demand, any registration plate or card
- 7 which has been suspended is guilty of a summary offense and
- 8 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$100.
- 9 § 1540. Surrender of license.
- 10 (a) Conviction of offense. -- Upon a conviction for any
- 11 offense which calls for mandatory revocation in accordance with
- 12 section 1532 (relating to revocation or suspension of operating
- 13 privilege), the court or the district attorney shall require the
- 14 surrender of any driver's license then held by the defendant and
- 15 shall forward the driver's license together with a record of the
- 16 conviction to the department.
- 17 (b) Suspension of operating privilege.--Upon the suspension
- 18 of the operating privilege of any person by the department, the
- 19 department shall forthwith notify the person in writing to
- 20 surrender his driver's license to the department for the term of
- 21 suspension.
- 22 (c) Seizure of revoked and suspended licenses.--The
- 23 department may delegate authority to any authorized department
- 24 employee[, member of the Pennsylvania State Police or local
- 25 police officer] or constable to seize the driver's license of
- 26 any person when the operating privilege of that person has been
- 27 revoked or suspended and his driver's license has been ordered
- 28 to be surrendered by a court or district attorney or by the
- 29 department. The department shall, by regulation, prescribe the
- 30 manner of selecting the employees and [State and local police

- 1 officers] <u>constables</u> to seize the drivers' licenses.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
