AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for retail electric consumer
- 3 protection.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 66 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 6 <u>§ 2801-A. Scope of chapter.</u>
- 7 This chapter relates to retail electric consumer protection.
- 8 § 2802-A. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- "Cancellation fee or early termination fee." An amount
- 13 specified in a contract that permits an electric generation
- 14 <u>supplier to assess and collect a fee or other similar charge</u>
- 15 from a residential or small commercial customer who terminates a
- 16 contract before the end of the contract term, regardless of:
- 17 (1) how the fee or other similar charge is identified in
- 18 the contract; or
- 19 (2) whether or not the fee or other similar charge is
- fixed or subject to calculation based on market factors.
- 21 "Contract." The terms and conditions of service provided by
- 22 an electric generation supplier.
- 23 "Default service provider." An electric distribution company
- 24 within its certified service territory or an alternative
- 25 <u>supplier approved by the commission that provides generation</u>
- 26 service to retail electric customers who:
- 27 (1) contract for electric power, including energy and
- 28 capacity, and the chosen electric generation supplier does
- 29 <u>not supply the service; or</u>
- 30 (2) do not choose an alternative electric generation

- 1 supplier.
- 2 "Electric distribution company." A public utility that
- 3 provides facilities for the jurisdictional transmission and
- 4 <u>distribution of electricity to retail customers, except building</u>
- 5 or facility owners or operators that manage the internal
- 6 <u>distribution system serving a building or facility and that</u>
- 7 <u>supply electric power and other related electric power services</u>
- 8 to occupants of the building or facility.
- 9 <u>"Electric generation supplier." A person or corporation,</u>
- 10 including a municipal corporation that chooses to provide
- 11 service outside the municipal corporation's municipal limits,
- 12 except to the extent provided before January 1, 1997, brokers
- 13 and marketers, aggregators or any other entity, that sells to
- 14 end-use customers electricity or related services utilizing the
- 15 jurisdictional transmission or distribution facilities of an
- 16 <u>electric distribution company or that purchases, brokers,</u>
- 17 arranges or markets electricity or related services for sale to
- 18 end-use customers utilizing the jurisdictional transmission and
- 19 distribution facilities of an electric distribution company. The
- 20 term does not include an electric distribution company or any of
- 21 the following:
- 22 (1) A building or facility owner or operator that
- 23 manages the internal distribution system serving the building
- or facility and that supplies electric power and other
- 25 <u>related power services to occupants of the building or</u>
- 26 facility.
- 27 (2) An electric cooperative corporation, except as
- provided in 15 Pa.C.S. Ch. 74 (relating to generation choice
- 29 <u>for customers of electric cooperatives).</u>
- 30 (3) A default service provider.

- 1 <u>"Fixed rate product." A retail electric generation product</u>
- 2 when the rate charged per kilowatt hour for each billing period
- 3 of the contract term is the same.
- 4 "Residential customer." Any of the following:
- 5 (1) An individual:
- 6 (i) who enters into a contract to receive service
- 7 <u>from an electric generation supplier;</u>
- 8 <u>(ii) whose name is listed on a residential service</u>
- 9 <u>account; and</u>
- 10 (iii) who is primarily responsible for payment of
- bills rendered for the service.
- 12 (2) An occupant of a residence receiving service who is
- 13 <u>18 years of age or older and whose name appears on the</u>
- 14 <u>mortgage</u>, <u>deed or lease of the residence</u>.
- "Small commercial customer." A nonresidential customer who
- 16 <u>enters into a contract to receive electric generation service</u>
- 17 from an electric generation supplier and has a peak demand of
- 18 less than 50 kilowatts during any 12-month period.
- 19 "Switch." The transfer of a residential or small commercial
- 20 customer from any of the following:
- 21 (1) An electric generation supplier's service to another
- 22 <u>electric generation supplier's service.</u>
- 23 (2) A default service provider's service to an electric
- 24 generation supplier's service.
- 25 (3) An electric generation supplier's service to a
- default service provider's service.
- 27 <u>"Variable rate product." A retail electric generation</u>
- 28 product for which the rate may vary based upon fluctuations in
- 29 wholesale electric market prices.
- 30 § 2803-A. Variable rate product contract terms.

- 1 (a) Contract duration. -- A contract for a variable rate
- 2 product offered by an electric generation supplier to a
- 3 residential or small commercial customer may be for a term of no
- 4 <u>less than six months.</u>
- 5 (b) Fees prohibited. -- A contract under subsection (a) may
- 6 not contain a cancellation fee or an early termination fee.
- 7 § 2804-A. Fixed rate product contract terms.
- 8 (a) Contract duration. -- A contract for a fixed rate product
- 9 offered by an electric generation supplier to a residential or
- 10 small commercial customer may not be for a term of less than 12
- 11 months.
- 12 (b) Fees prohibited. -- A contract for a fixed rate product
- 13 for a term of less than 24 months offered by an electric
- 14 generation supplier to a residential or small commercial
- 15 <u>customer may not contain a cancellation fee or an early</u>
- 16 termination fee.
- 17 (c) Contract expiration. --
- 18 (1) Upon the expiration of a contract for a fixed rate
- 19 <u>product, an electric generation supplier may not switch a</u>
- 20 residential or small commercial customer to a contract for a
- 21 variable rate product.
- 22 (2) The electric generation supplier shall provide
- 23 service to a residential or small commercial customer whose
- 24 contract for a fixed rate product has expired at the fixed
- 25 <u>rate posted on the PA Power Switch Internet website on the</u>
- 26 <u>date when the contract expired.</u>
- 27 (3) The electric generation supplier shall charge the
- 28 rate under paragraph (2) until the earliest of the following:
- 29 <u>(i) the customer enters into a new contract;</u>
- 30 (ii) the customer switches to another electric

- 1 <u>generation supplier; or</u>
- 2 (iii) the customer returns to a default service
- 3 provider's service.
- 4 § 2805-A. Contract provisions.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- An electric generation supplier shall
- 6 <u>include the following provisions in no less than 12-point font</u>
- 7 <u>in a contract for a variable rate product or fixed rate product:</u>
- 8 (1) The name, address, toll-free telephone number,
- 9 <u>mailing address, e-mail address, Internet website and</u>
- 10 commission certification number of the electric generation
- 11 <u>supplier.</u>
- 12 (2) The rate applicable to the contract term.
- 13 <u>(3) The expiration date of the contract.</u>
- 14 (4) A statement in all capital letters that authorizes
- the customer to rescind the contract within three business
- days of receipt of the contract without incurring a
- 17 cancellation fee or an early termination fee.
- 18 (b) Mailbox rule. -- A contract provided to a customer via
- 19 first class mail shall be deemed received by the customer within
- 20 three business days of being placed in the mail.
- 21 (c) Variable rate product contracts. -- An electric generation
- 22 supplier shall include the following provisions in no less than
- 23 <u>12-point font in a contract for a variable rate product:</u>
- 24 (1) An explanation of the method or formula used to
- 25 <u>calculate rates for a variable rate product.</u>
- 26 (2) A statement specifying that variable rates are
- 27 <u>subject to change.</u>
- 28 (3) An Internet website or toll-free telephone number
- 29 <u>that a customer may call for current variable rate product</u>
- 30 pricing information.

- 1 (d) Fee provisions. -- An electric generation supplier shall
- 2 <u>include the amount and terms of a cancellation or early</u>
- 3 termination fee in no less than 12-point font in a contract for
- 4 <u>a fixed rate product with a term of more than 24 months.</u>
- 5 <u>§ 2806-A. Variable rate changes.</u>
- 6 (a) Limitations on rate changes. -- The kilowatt hour rate
- 7 charged to a residential or small commercial customer under a
- 8 contract for a variable rate product may not be increased:
- 9 <u>(1) More than once every six months.</u>
- 10 (2) More than 100% of the rate charged during the
- 11 <u>preceding six-month period.</u>
- 12 (b) Basis of changes. -- An adjustment in the rate must be
- 13 <u>based upon fluctuations in wholesale electric prices and the</u>
- 14 <u>actual costs incurred by an electric generation supplier to</u>
- 15 provide service.
- 16 § 2807-A. Variable and fixed product rates.
- 17 (a) Rate notice.--
- 18 (1) No less than once every 30 days, an electric
- 19 <u>generation supplier offering service to residential or small</u>
- 20 commercial customers shall post the current rate for each
- 21 variable rate and fixed rate product on the PA Power Switch
- 22 Internet website and shall provide the rate information via a
- toll-free telephone number.
- 24 (2) Upon request by a residential or small commercial
- 25 customer, the electric generation supplier shall provide the
- 26 current rate for each variable rate and fixed rate product in
- 27 writing to the customer. The rate shall be contained in the
- 28 electric generation supplier's marketing and sales materials,
- 29 including telephone solicitations.
- 30 (b) Charge prohibition. -- A rate posted under subsection (a)

- 1 may not be an introductory or promotional rate. An electric
- 2 generation supplier may not charge a new residential and small
- 3 commercial customer more than the rate posted under subsection
- 4 (a) at the time the contract is formed.
- 5 (c) Rate history.--
- 6 (1) No later than January 30 of each year, an electric
- 7 <u>generation supplier offering service to residential or small</u>
- 8 <u>commercial customers shall post a one-year price history for</u>
- 9 each variable rate and fixed rate product for the preceding
- 10 year, or a history of each product offered for less than one
- 11 year, on the PA Power Switch Internet website and the
- 12 <u>electric generation supplier's Internet website.</u>
- 13 (2) Upon request by a residential or small commercial
- customer, the electric generation supplier shall provide the
- price history as required under paragraph (1) in writing to
- 16 the customer.
- 17 § 2808-A. Contract formation.
- 18 An electric generation supplier may not provide service to a
- 19 residential or small commercial customer without the customer's
- 20 written signature on a contract, authorization form or other
- 21 form of verification as permitted by the commission to initiate
- 22 service, renew service or switch service.
- 23 § 2809-A. Duties of electric generation suppliers and electric
- 24 <u>distribution companies.</u>
- 25 (a) Electric generation supplier. -- An electric generation
- 26 supplier shall have the following duties:
- 27 (1) No later than one business day after a contract to
- initiate service, renew service or switch service is
- 29 authorized to be formed under section 2808-A (relating to
- 30 contract formation), send a copy of the contract to the

- 1 <u>customer. At the option of the customer, the electronic</u>
- 2 generation supplier shall provide the copy to the customer
- 3 in-person, by first class mail or electronically.
- 4 (2) No later than one business day after expiration of
- 5 <u>the three-day rescission period under section 2805-A</u>
- 6 (relating to contract provisions), notify the electric
- 7 <u>distribution company of a switch request by the customer.</u>
- 8 (b) Electric distribution company. -- No later than 14
- 9 <u>business days after receiving notice under subsection (a)(2)</u>,
- 10 the electric distribution company shall process the switch
- 11 request. The electric distribution company may recover the
- 12 reasonable costs associated with processing the switching
- 13 <u>request.</u>
- 14 <u>§ 2810-A. Consumer education information.</u>
- 15 (a) Information compilation. -- The commission shall compile
- 16 <u>the following information:</u>
- 17 (1) A list of each electric generation supplier licensed
- 18 by the commission.
- 19 (2) The types of services offered by each electric
- 20 generation supplier and the advantages and disadvantages of
- 21 the services.
- 22 (3) The number of customer complaints filed against each
- 23 <u>electric generation supplier and the disposition of the</u>
- complaints.
- 25 (4) Any information the commission determines will
- assist customers in making informed decisions when choosing
- 27 <u>an electric generation supplier.</u>
- 28 (b) Publication of information. -- The commission shall post
- 29 the information on the PA Power Switch Internet website and,
- 30 upon request of a customer, make the information available in

- 1 writing to the customer. The commission shall provide the
- 2 <u>information in a standard format that is easily understandable</u>
- 3 <u>by a layperson.</u>
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
