AN ACT

Amending the act of March 7, 1901 (P.L.20, No. 14), entitled "An 1 2 act for the government of cities of the second class," 3 providing for police power to arrest. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Article III of the act of March 7, 1901 (P.L.20, No.14), referred to as the Second Class City Law, is amended by 8 adding a section to read: 9 ARTICLE III. 10 Department of Public Safety. 11 12 Section 2. Each police officer shall have the power to make 13 arrests without warrant and upon view when the offense is a 14 felony or misdemeanor committed in the presence of the police officer or when there is probable cause that a felony or 15 misdemeanor has been committed. A police officer shall issue 16 17 citations, summons and trial notices for summary offenses and ordinance violations. A police officer may make arrests for 18

- summary offenses and ordinance violations where:
- I. The person could not provide satisfactory evidence of 2
- 3 personal identification.
- 4 II. The person arrested was so intoxicated that he or she
- 5 could have been a danger to himself or herself or to others.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 6
