1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of December 22, 1983 (P.L.306, No.84), entitled "An act providing for the State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers and Salespersons; and providing penalties," defining "retail gasoline dispenser" and "retail heating oil dispenser"; further providing for powers and duties of the State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers and Salespersons and for license to engage in business; providing for unlawful act by retail gasoline dispenser or retail heating oil dispenser; further providing for penalties; and providing for civil action for violation by retail gasoline dispenser or retail heating oil dispenser.

13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of December 22, 1983
15	(P.L.306, No.84), known as the Board of Vehicles Act, is amended
16	by adding definitions to read:
17	Section 2. Definitions.
18	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
19	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
20	context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 <u>"Retail gasoline dispenser." A person that owns a vehicle</u>
- 2 <u>used to transport gasoline which is sold on a retail basis.</u>
- 3 <u>"Retail heating oil dispenser." A person that owns a vehicle</u>
- 4 <u>used to transport heating oil.</u>

- 6 Section 2. Section 4 of the act, amended October 18, 2000
- 7 (P.L.577, No.75), is amended to read:
- 8 Section 4. Powers and duties of board.
- 9 (a) Powers and duties.--The board shall have the power and
- 10 its duty shall be to:
- 11 (1) Provide for and regulate the licensing of <u>retail</u>
- 12 gasoline dispensers, retail heating oil dispensers,
- salespersons, dealers, vehicle auctions, manufacturers,
- 14 factory branches, distributors, distributor branches and
- 15 factory or distributor representatives as defined in this
- 16 act.
- 17 (2) Review and pass upon the qualifications of
- applicants for licensure and to issue, except as otherwise
- 19 provided herein, a license to engage in the said businesses
- to any applicant who is approved by the board and who meets
- 21 the requirements of this act and regulations promulgated in
- 22 accordance with this act.
- 23 (3) Investigate on its own initiative, upon complaint of
- the Department of Transportation, Department of Community and
- 25 Economic Development, Department of Revenue or the Office of
- the Attorney General, any law enforcement officer or upon the
- verified complaint in writing of any person, any allegations
- 28 of the wrongful act or acts of any licensee or person
- 29 required to be licensed hereunder. Duly authorized agents of
- 30 the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs shall be

- 1 authorized to issue administrative citations for violations
- of this act in accordance with section 5 of the act of July
- 3 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the
- 4 General Counsel or his designee to issue subpoenas for
- 5 certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing
- 6 examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 7 Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of
- 8 Professional and Occupational Affairs; and further providing
- 9 for civil penalties and license suspension."
- 10 (4) Administer and enforce this act and to impose
- 11 appropriate administrative discipline upon licensees found to
- 12 be in violation of this act.
- 13 (5) Bring criminal prosecutions for unauthorized,
- unlicensed or unlawful practice and bring an action to enjoin
- such practices. Duly authorized agents of the bureau shall be
- authorized to issue citations in accordance with section 5(a)
- of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act
- 18 empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue
- 19 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing
- 20 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and
- Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the
- 22 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and
- 23 further providing for civil penalties and license
- 24 suspension, " for violations of this act.
- 25 (6) Require each licensee to register biennially with
- 26 the board.
- 27 (7) Keep a record showing the names and addresses of all
- 28 licensees licensed under this act.
- 29 (8) Keep minutes and records of all its transactions and
- 30 proceedings especially with relation to the issuance, denial,

- 1 registration, formal reprimand, suspension and revocation of
- licenses. In all actions or proceedings in any court, a
- 3 transcript of any board record or any part thereof, which is
- 4 certified to be a true copy by the board, shall be entitled
- 5 to admission in evidence.
- 6 (9) Adopt, promulgate and enforce such rules and
- 7 regulations consistent with this act as are deemed necessary
- 8 and proper to effectuate the provisions of this act.
- 9 (10) Submit annually, to the Consumer Protection and
- 10 Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate and the
- 11 Professional Licensure Committee of the House of
- Representatives, a description of the types of complaints
- 13 received, status of the cases, board action which has been
- taken and length of time from the initial complaint to final
- 15 board resolution.
- 16 (11) Submit annually to the department an estimate of
- the financial requirements of the board for its
- 18 administrative, investigative, legal and miscellaneous
- 19 expenses.
- 20 (12) Submit annually to the House and Senate
- 21 Appropriations Committees, 15 days after the Governor has
- 22 submitted his budget to the General Assembly, a copy of the
- 23 budget request for the upcoming fiscal year which the board
- 24 previously submitted to the department.
- 25 (b) Summary proceedings.--All law enforcement officers in
- 26 this Commonwealth may institute summary criminal proceedings in
- 27 accordance with the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure for
- 28 violations of this act. Any person who violates this act shall
- 29 be subject to criminal prosecution as provided in section 28.

- 2 Section 5. License to engage in business.
- 3 (a) License required.--
- 4 (1) To promote the public safety and welfare, it shall
- 5 be unlawful for any person to engage in the business as a
- 6 <u>retail gasoline dispenser, retail heating oil dispenser,</u>
- 7 salesperson, dealer, branch lot, wholesale vehicle auction,
- 8 public or retail vehicle auction, manufacturer, factory
- 9 branch, distributor, distributor branch, factory
- 10 representative or distributor representative within this
- 11 Commonwealth unless the person has secured a license as
- 12 required under this act.
- 13 (2) A person, including, but not limited to,
- salespersons, shall not engage in the business for his own
- benefit or profit unless he is licensed in accordance with
- 16 this act.
- 17 (3) A person shall not act as, offer to act as or hold
- himself out to be a broker in the advertising, buying or
- 19 selling of any new or used vehicle.

- 21 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 22 Section 17.1. Unlawful act by retail gasoline dispenser or
- retail heating oil dispenser.
- 24 (a) Unlawful to engage in price gouging. -- It shall be a
- 25 <u>violation of this act for a retail gasoline dispenser or a</u>
- 26 retail heating oil dispenser to engage in price gouging.
- 27 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 28 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 29 <u>subsection:</u>
- 30 <u>"Abnormal disruption of the market." A set of conditions</u>

- 1 which result in a national, State or local state of emergency
- 2 being declared or a named tropical storm or hurricane which
- 3 threatens this Commonwealth.
- 4 "Price gouging." Charging a price for gasoline sold at the
- 5 retail level or heating oil sold to consumers which represents a
- 6 gross disparity between the price of gasoline or heating oil
- 7 <u>immediately preceding the onset of an abnormal disruption of the</u>
- 8 market and the price charged after the abnormal disruption of
- 9 the market. The term does not include the amount charged which
- 10 <u>is attributable to additional costs imposed upon a retail</u>
- 11 gasoline dispenser or a retail heating oil dispenser by retail
- 12 gasoline or heating oil suppliers.
- Section 5. Section 28 of the act, amended October 18, 2000
- 14 (P.L.577, No.75), is amended to read:
- 15 Section 28. Penalties.
- 16 (a) Criminal penalties for violation of this act.--Whoever
- 17 shall give any false or forged evidence of any kind to the board
- 18 or to any member in order to obtain a license, or shall refuse
- 19 upon request to furnish business records, documents and files
- 20 relating to practice under this act, or shall otherwise violate
- 21 the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a summary offense
- 22 and, upon conviction, shall be ordered to pay a fine of \$1,000.
- 23 A licensee shall be subject to criminal prosecution under this
- 24 subsection for violation of any provision of this act.
- 25 (b) Criminal penalties for unlicensed activity. -- Whoever
- 26 engages in the business of retail gasoline dispenser, retail
- 27 heating oil dispenser, vehicle dealer, manufacturer, factory
- 28 branch, distributor, distributor branch, auction or broker or
- 29 engages in the occupation of vehicle salesperson or factory or
- 30 distributor representative without being licensed and registered

- 1 as required or exempted from licensure as provided, or shall
- 2 present or attempt to use as his own the license of another,
- 3 shall be guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction, shall
- 4 be sentenced to pay a fine of \$1,000 or any higher amount equal
- 5 to double the pecuniary gain derived from the offense. For the
- 6 purpose of this act the sale of each vehicle in violation of
- 7 this act constitutes a separate offense.
- 8 (c) Additional remedy.--In addition to any other civil
- 9 remedy or criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board
- 10 by a vote of the majority of the authorized membership of the
- 11 board as provided by law, or by a vote of the majority of the
- 12 duly qualified and confirmed membership, may levy a civil
- 13 penalty of up to \$1,000 on any current licensee who violates any
- 14 provision of this act or on any person who engages in an
- 15 activity required to be licensed by this act. The board shall
- 16 levy this penalty only after affording the accused party the
- 17 opportunity for a hearing as provided in 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to
- 18 administrative law and procedure).
- 19 Section 6. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 20 <u>Section 29.1. Civil action for violation by retail gasoline</u>
- 21 <u>dispenser or retail heating oil dispenser.</u>
- 22 In addition to the civil or criminal penalties provided for
- 23 in this act, the Attorney General may bring an action in a court
- 24 of competent jurisdiction in the name of the Commonwealth for
- 25 damages and equitable relief, including injunctive relief, if a
- 26 retail qasoline dispenser or a retail heating oil dispenser has
- 27 violated or is about to violate section 17.1.
- 28 Section 7. The provisions of this act are severable. If any
- 29 provision of this act or its application to any person or
- 30 circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect

- 1 other provisions or applications of this act which can be given
- 2 effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Section 8. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 3
