AN ACT

- No.6), entitled "An act relating to mental health and mental

 - appropriation, "further providing for requirements for
- 6 directors of State facilities.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 203, act of October 20, 1966 (3rd
- 10 Sp.Sess., P.L.96, No.6), known as the "Mental Health and Mental
- 11 Retardation Act of 1966," is amended to read:
- 12 Section 203. Qualifications of Directors of State
- 13 Facilities. -- Each State operated facility shall be in charge of
- 14 a director who shall have the following qualifications:
- 15 (1) Experience in the administration of mental hospitals,
- 16 other hospitals, institutions or other facilities.
- 17 (2) Ability to organize, direct and coordinate the operation
- 18 of the facility and its programs.
- 19 (3) In the case where the facility is a State operated

- 1 mental hospital, he shall [also] be a physician where possible
- 2 or demonstrate, through objective measurements developed by the
- 3 <u>department</u>, knowledge and competencies in the field of mental
- 4 <u>health and illness, including community mental health, as well</u>
- 5 as in the field of health care administration. A master's
- 6 <u>degree</u>, or appropriate equivalent thereof, shall be required.
- 7 The director of the clinical program of the hospital shall be a
- 8 physician who shall be responsible for planning and executing
- 9 programs of treatment and therapy.
- 10 (4) The department by regulation may establish additional
- 11 standards of qualification for the position of director.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
