AN ACT

7	AMENDING THE ACT OF JUNE 30, 1975 (NO.8-A), ENTITLED "AN ACT TO	<
8	PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND	
9	JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND	
10	FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD JULY 1, 1975 TO	
11	JUNE 30, 1976, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND	
12	REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL PERIOD ENDING	
13	JUNE 30, 1975, MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF	
14	AGRICULTURE TO ASSIST IN THE COMMONWEALTH'S 4-H CLUB HORSE	
15	AND PONY SHOW, AND TO THE PENNSYLVANIA HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY	
16	FOR REDEMPTION OF OUTSTANDING BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES AND	
17	UNFUNDED OBLIGATIONS; AND CHANGING CERTAIN APPROPRIATIONS TO	
18	THE DEPARTMENTS OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS, EDUCATION, AND REVENUE	
19	AND TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC TELEVISION NETWORK COMMISSION.	
20	WHEREAS, It has been demonstrated that the work of the 4 H	<
21	Clubs has been instrumental in developing an interest in	
22	agriculture among the rural youth of Pennsylvania and provides	
23	supervised training for the farm boys and girls and encourages	
24	qualities of leadership among our youth; and	

- 1 WHEREAS, It has been demonstrated that the apprentice
- 2 training offered 4 H youths has encouraged a scientific approach
- 3 to agriculture and thus increased efficiency on Pennsylvania
- 4 farms; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The most effective apprentice training for 4 H
- 6 members on selection, raising, fitting and showing of farm
- 7 animals has resulted in the creation of local county and
- 8 district shows, and also has created the need for a Statewide
- 9 show; the county and district shows have been financed by local
- 10 contributions; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The fast expansion of these shows and the necessity
- 12 of further expansion to meet the educational requirements of
- 13 farmers of today has made it impossible to finance these shows
- 14 beyond the county level entirely by local contributions;
- 15 therefore
- 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 17 hereby enacts as follows:
- 18 Section 1. The sum of \$30,000 or as much thereof as may be
- 19 necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department
- 20 of Agriculture to pay the expenses of holding ten annual 4 H
- 21 Club horse and pony shows and one Statewide show to be held in
- 22 the fall as preliminary to the Keystone International Livestock
- 23 Show.
- 24 SECTION 1. SECTION 2, ACT OF JUNE 30, 1975 (NO.8-A), KNOWN
- 25 AS THE "GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 1975," IS AMENDED BY ADDING

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- 26 AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE; AMENDING THE
- 27 APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR
- 28 HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT, ADDED DECEMBER 16, 1975 (NO.50-A), TO
- 29 THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR SINKING FUND CHARGES, FOR SOCIAL
- 30 SECURITY CONTRIBUTIONS AND FOR PROGRAMS AT STATE SCHOOLS AND

- 1 HOSPITALS; TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE FOR OPERATING EXPENSES,
- 2 AMENDED DECEMBER 16, 1975 (NO.50-A), AND TO THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 3 PUBLIC TELEVISION NETWORK COMMISSION, AMENDED DECEMBER 16, 1975
- 4 (NO.50-A); AND ADDING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 5 HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY TO READ:
- 6 SECTION 2. THE FOLLOWING SUMS, OR AS MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE
- 7 NECESSARY, ARE HEREBY SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED FROM THE GENERAL
- 8 FUND TO THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER NAMED AGENCIES OF THE EXECUTIVE,
- 9 LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE
- 10 PAYMENT OF THE SALARIES, WAGES OR OTHER COMPENSATION AND TRAVEL
- 11 EXPENSE OF THE DULY ELECTED OR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES
- 12 OF THE COMMONWEALTH, FOR PAYMENT OF FEES OF CONTRACTUAL SERVICES
- 13 RENDERED, FOR THE PURCHASE OR RENTAL OF GOODS, SERVICES,
- 14 PRINTING, EQUIPMENT, LAND AND BUILDINGS AND FOR PAYMENT OF ANY
- 15 OTHER EXPENSES, AS PROVIDED BY LAW OR BY THIS ACT, NECESSARY FOR
- 16 THE PROPER CONDUCT OF THE DUTIES, FUNCTIONS AND ACTIVITIES AND
- 17 FOR THE PURPOSES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD
- 18 BEGINNING JULY 1, 1975 AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND
- 19 REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE

27	NOTES OUTSTANDING ON JANUARY 17, 1976; PROVIDED
28	THAT THE PENNSYLVANIA HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY
29	SHALL REPAY THE GENERAL FUND OF THE COMMONWEALTH
30	THE AMOUNT PAID TO THE SPECIAL FUND BY THE COMMON-

- 1 WEALTH; SAID AMOUNT TO BE REPAID FROM THE SPECIAL
- 2 FUND THROUGH SALES OF BONDS, AS SOON AS PRACTICAL
- 3 AFTER SAID SALES, OR FROM THE MONEYS RECEIVED BY
- 4 THE AGENCY IN PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND IN-
- 5 TEREST ON THE LOANS FOR WHICH THE NOTES WERE
- 6 <u>ISSUED TO THE COMMONWEALTH. THIS APPROPRIATION</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
