17	Section 507. Amount of PensionExcept as provided for

payment for nursing home care, the amount paid after the effective date of this act to an eligible blind person having actual annual income of his own of two thousand five hundred eighty dollars (\$2580) or less shall be [eighty-five dollars (\$85)] <u>ninety dollars (\$90)</u> monthly, and the monthly amount paid to any other eligible blind person shall be fixed in such amount that the sum of his actual annual income and State blind pension equals [three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3600)] <u>three</u>

9 <u>thousand eight hundred dollars (\$3,800)</u> a year.
