In the House of Representatives, June 30, 1976

- 1 WHEREAS, Serious questions have been raised as to whether the
- 2 moneys allocated by Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to
- 3 the 11 maintenance districts and 67 counties in the Commonwealth
- 4 for the operation of the maintenance programs for State roads
- 5 and of the county maintenance district facilities is distributed
- 6 on an equitable and logical basis; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The amounts of revenue expended by the various
- 8 maintenance districts and counties over the past several years
- 9 have varied from year to year to such an extent that there seems
- 10 to be no criteria or standards for the allocation and
- 11 distribution of maintenance moneys to the 11 maintenance
- 12 districts and 67 counties; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Many factors may be used in determining alternative
- 14 formulas and methods for the allocation and distribution of
- 15 maintenance funds to the 11 maintenance districts and 67
- 16 counties; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation

- 1 make a thorough analysis of the flow of maintenance funds to the
- 2 11 maintenance districts and 67 counties for the past four
- 3 years. In doing so, the Pennsylvania Department of
- 4 Transportation shall make a thorough investigation of various
- 5 alternative formulas to include factors such as:
- 6 (1) number of miles of State highways in the particular
- 7 county;
- 8 (2) the population of the particular county;
- 9 (3) the number of vehicles registered from the particular
- 10 county;
- 11 (4) such other factors as may be determined by the Secretary
- 12 of Transportation,
- 13 by which maintenance funds may be allocated and of what changes,
- 14 if any, should be made in the method of allocation and
- 15 distribution of maintenance moneys to the 11 maintenance
- 16 districts and the 67 counties as presently constituted; and be
- 17 it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of Transportation report his
- 19 findings and recommendations on these alternative formulas and
- 20 methods to the General Assembly no later than December 31, 1976;
- 21 and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the
- 23 Secretary of Transportation, the Honorable William H. Sherlock.
