AN ACT

1 Amending the act of January 24, 1966 (1965 P.L.1535, No.537),
2 entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the planning and
3 regulation of community sewage systems and individual sewage
4 systems; requiring municipalities to submit plans for systems
5 in their jurisdiction; authorizing grants; requiring permits
6 for persons installing such systems; authorizing the
7 Department of Environmental Resources to adopt and administer
8 rules, regulations, standards and procedures; creating an
9 advisory committee; providing remedies and prescribing
10 penalties," further providing for certain local rules,
11 regulations and standards.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Clause (9) of subsection (b) of section 8, act of
15 January 24, 1966 (1965 P.L.1535, No.537), known as the
16 "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act," amended July 22, 1974
17 (P.L.621, No.208), is amended to read:

18 Section 8. Powers and Duties of Local Agencies.--* * *

19 (b) Each local agency in addition to the powers and duties
20 conferred upon it by existing law shall have the power and the
21 duty:

22 * * *

23 (9) To adopt and maintain standards and procedures for

1 applications and permits identical to those of the department.
2 Any other rules or regulations which the local agency deems
3 necessary in order to administer and enforce section 7 may only
4 be adopted if they are consistent with this act and the rules
5 and regulations adopted hereunder: Provided, That the county
6 health department of a local agency, or if none, the local
7 agency, shall adopt rules, regulations and standards to conform
8 to special glacial or alluvial soils and particular hydrological
9 conditions found in certain counties of the Commonwealth.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
