## AN ACT

1 2 3	To require the country of origin to be displayed on every motor vehicle sold in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and providing penalties.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. (a) It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for
7	sale a new motor vehicle in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	without the information required in section 2.
9	(b) It shall be unlawful for a manufacturer or assembler of
LO	a motor vehicle to deliver for sale a motor vehicle in the
11	Commonwealth of Pennsylvania without attaching to the motor
12	vehicle the information required in section 2.

1 Section 2. Every new motor vehicle sold, offered for sale or 2 delivered for sale within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall 3 include in letters at least two inches high the country in which 4 the motor vehicle is manufactured or assembled. Such information 5 shall be displayed so that it is clearly visible and shall be 6 attached firmly to the motor vehicle.

7 Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove the8 information required in section 2.

9 Section 4. Persons willfully violating this act shall be
10 guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
11 subject to a fine of \$500 or ten days imprisonment or both.
12 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
