AN ACT

1 Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An
2 act concerning townships of the second class; and amending,
3 revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating
4 thereto," providing for the incompatibility of certain
5 offices.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Section 411, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69),
9 known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended
10 July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567) and amended December 1, 1965
11 (P.L.1025, No.379), is amended to read:

12 Section 411. Auditors.--At each municipal election, the
13 electors of each township shall elect one auditor to serve for a
14 term of six years from the first Monday of January next
15 following his election.

16 No auditor shall at the same time hold any other elective or
17 appointive township office in the township in which he is
18 employed as an auditor, and no auditor shall at the same time
19 hold any other elective or appointive school district office or

1 employment in any school district of the second, third or fourth
2 class if he audits any finances or any funds belonging to or
3 controlled by the school district. For the purposes of this
4 section, membership on the township planning commission shall be
5 deemed to be an appointive township office.

6 Section 2. Section 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805,
7 No.247), known as the "Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning
8 Code," is repealed insofar as inconsistent with this act.

9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
