A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
- of Pennsylvania, reducing the size of the General Assembly.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby resolves as follows:
- 5 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 6 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with
- 7 the provisions of Article XI thereof:
- 8 That section 16 of Article II be amended to read:
- 9 § 16. Legislative districts.
- 10 The Commonwealth shall be divided into 50 senatorial and
- 11 [203] 150 representative districts, which shall be composed of
- 12 compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population
- 13 as practicable. Each senatorial district which shall consist of
- 14 three representative districts shall elect one Senator, and each
- 15 representative district one Representative. Unless absolutely
- 16 necessary no county, city, incorporated town, borough, township
- 17 or ward shall be divided in forming either a senatorial or

- 2 SCHEDULE
- 3 The foregoing amendment to Article II of the Constitution of
- 4 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall become effective the year
- 5 following that in which the next Federal decennial census is
- 6 officially reported as required by Federal Law. The first
- 7 elections after reapportionment of the Commonwealth under
- 8 section 17 to conform to the foregoing amendment shall be held
- 9 in the year 1982. At the general election in the year 1982
- 10 Senators in odd-numbered districts and all Representatives shall
- 11 be chosen to serve for two years and Senators in even-numbered
- 12 districts shall be chosen to serve for four years. Thereafter,
- 13 all Senators shall be chosen to serve for four years. The terms
- 14 of all Senators in office in 1982 shall expire November 30,
- 15 1982.
