SENATOR SMITH, APPROPRIATIONS, IN SENATE, AS AMENDED, MAY 31, 1978

A SUPPLEMENT

- To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an 2 3 4 instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a Staterelated university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and 6 7 8 the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing 9 appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of 10 expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public 11 12 support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of 13 bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of 14 15 the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for 16 17 payments of such appropriations, and providing a method of 18 accounting for the funds appropriated. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
- 22 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees
- 23 of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1978
- 24 to June 30, 1979, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:
- 25 (1) For educational and general expenses.... \$55,500,000

7	Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on	
8	account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in	
9	section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall	be
10	made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.	
11	Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be ma	ade
12	on the basis of full-time student enrollment at a rate not	to
13	exceed \$7,465 per student. As a condition of receiving its	
14	appropriation, on or after January 1, 1979, the university	
15	medical school shall, when accepting first year students for	r the
16	next term, set aside 10% of the total number of admissions	Eor
17	students who agree that upon the completion of their medical	l
18	training, they shall engage in the practice of medicine for	a
19	period of four years in an area termed medically deprived by	y the
20	Pennsylvania Department of Health.	
21	Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may	Y
22	transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section	1,
23	clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount	
24	transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fig	scal
25	year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropri	iated
26	for that purpose.	
27	Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of	the
28	appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during	the
29	fiscal year.	
30	Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the	ne

- 1 provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs and
- 2 full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program.
- 3 The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of
- 4 Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly
- 5 and to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth not later than 30 days
- 6 prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.
- 7 Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the
- 8 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are
- 9 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper
- 10 records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than
- 11 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act
- 12 relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the
- 13 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor
- 14 General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each
- 15 branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and
- 16 purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by
- 17 this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year,
- 18 the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of
- 19 Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a
- 20 basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.
- 21 Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time
- 22 students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs
- 23 shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth,
- 24 and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys
- 25 appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures
- 26 made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such
- 27 sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to
- 28 the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall
- 29 also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the
- 30 Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as

- 1 to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the
- 2 university from moneys other than those appropriated by this
- 3 act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and
- 4 he shall file annually with the General Assembly such
- 5 information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly
- 6 or any of its committees may require.
- 7 Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and
- 8 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and
- 9 House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs
- 10 except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be
- 11 submitted prior to November OCTOBER 1, 1979, shall cover the 12- <-
- 12 month period beginning September 1, 1978 and shall include for
- 13 each term during the period:
- 14 (1) The following counts and distributions:
- 15 (i) The definitions and numbers of full time faculty
- 16 members, of part time faculty members, FACULTY MEMBERS EMPLOYED <-
- 17 FULL-TIME, OF FACULTY MEMBERS EMPLOYED PART-TIME of full-time
- 18 students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students
- 19 enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students
- 20 enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled
- 21 in undergraduate courses.
- 22 (ii) A distribution of part time faculty members EMPLOYED

- 11 (3) For each term of the period covered for each full time <---
- 12 faculty member EMPLOYED FULL-TIME identified by school,

- 14 (i) An AN analysis of the average hours per week spent in <-
- 15 college or university-related activities, stating specifically
- 16 hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate
- 17 classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in
- 18 research and hours spent in public service.
- 19 (ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from college <--
- 20 or university funds.
- 21 SECTION 7. In addition to the above requirements relative to <---
- 22 this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period
- 23 beginning September 1, 1978, shall include for all programs of
- 24 the university:
- 25 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate
- 26 degree and for a master's degree.
- 27 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first
- 28 professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1976,
- 29 1977, 1978 and estimated 1979.
- The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and

- 1 present its financial statements required under the provisions
- 2 of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual"
- 3 (1975).
- 4 Section 7 8. The university shall provide such information

- 5 as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and
- 6 in such form and manner as the Department of Education may
- 7 prescribe.
- 8 Section 8 9. The university shall report its revenues and
- 9 expenditures and present its financial statements required under
- 10 the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted
- 11 accounting principles and procedures for educational
- 12 institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual"
- 13 United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)
- 14 with the exceptions set forth in the Commonwealth of
- 15 Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities,
- 16 Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979. Credits granted for non-
- 17 traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc.,
- 18 including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be
- 19 excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under
- 20 "Public Service."
- 21 Section 9 10. In addition to the requirements of section 6, <-
- 22 the University of Pittsburgh shall, by March 1, 1979, submit to
- 23 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and
- 24 the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted
- 25 for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus
- 26 including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures
- 27 budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.
- 28 Section 10 11. This act shall take effect immediately.
