REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, MAY 2, 1977

In the House of Representatives, April 27, 1977

- 1 WHEREAS, It is usually the intent of the United States
- 2 Congress to implement its public laws through rules and
- 3 regulations adopted by the relevant Federal executive agency;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, The proposed rules and regulations are prepared by
- 6 appropriate Federal agencies and then subjected to a period of
- 7 public review after publication in the Federal Register, with
- 8 limited time provided for the response; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The period for review is often very brief, thus
- 10 affording insufficient opportunity for those State agencies in
- 11 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania which will ultimately be
- 12 responsible for implementation, to provide adequate response;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Legislature would also like to be
- 15 afforded sufficient time for preparing recommendations;
- 16 therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly

- 1 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of
- 2 the United States to alter the Federal rule-making process to
- 3 assure that the Commonwealth's Legislature and its relevant
- 4 agencies be given the opportunity to comment on proposed rules
- 5 and regulations for a reasonable period prior to publication of
- 6 such proposals; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That these comments be considered and, where
- 8 possible, be incorporated into the proposed rules and
- 9 regulations when they are published in the Federal Register for
- 10 a period of public response; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 12 the presiding officer of each House of Congress of the United
- 13 States and to each Senator and Representative from Pennsylvania
- 14 in the Congress of the United States.
