# HOUSE BILL No. 91 Session of 1979

#### INTRODUCED BY GOEBEL, FEBRUARY 6, 1979

### REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION, FEBRUARY 6, 1979

#### AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto, " prohibiting ex-school board members 6 from holding an elected office for a period of two years. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 324, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 10 No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended January 18, 1967 (1969 P.L.963, No.429), is amended to read: 11 12 Section 324. Not to be Employed by or do Business with 13 District; Exceptions.--No school director shall, during the term for which he was elected or appointed, as a private person 14 15 engaged in any business transaction with the school district in which he is elected or appointed, be employed in any capacity by 16 the school district in which he is elected or appointed, or 17 18 receive from such school district any pay for services rendered to the district except as provided in this act: Provided, That 19 20 one who has served as a school director for two consecutive

terms, of six years each, may be elected to the position of 1 2 attorney or solicitor for the board of which he was a member by 3 the unanimous vote of all the other members of the board, and, 4 after resigning his office as school director, shall be entitled 5 to receive such pay for his services as solicitor as the board of school directors may determine: Provided, however, That a 6 7 school director may be appointed to the position of secretary to the board of a school district of the second class, of which he 8 was a member during the term for which he was elected or 9 10 appointed upon the unanimous consent of all the other members of 11 the board after resigning his office as school director, and he shall be entitled to receive such pay for his services as 12 13 secretary as the board of school directors shall determine: And 14 provided further, That one who has served as a school director 15 may, after resigning from office as a school director, be 16 elected to the position of teacher by the board of which he was a member by a vote of at least two-thirds of all other members 17 18 of the board and shall be entitled to receive such pay for his 19 services as a teacher as the board of school directors may 20 lawfully determine.

No school board shall draw, cause to be drawn or accept a specification for any item to be purchased by the school district that would limit the purchase of the item to the firm, corporation, partnership or other business entity of which a school director is an officer, agent or employe and exclude all other persons who could submit quotations or bid on an equivalent item.

No person who has served as a member of a school board for a
term of at least one year shall be eligible to hold an elected
public office until the expiration of two years from the time he
