- 4 § 5725. Civil action for unlawful interception, disclosure or
- 5 <u>use of wire or oral communication.</u>
- 6 (a) Cause of action. Any person whose wire or oral
- 7 communications is intercepted, disclosed or used in violation of
- 8 this chapter shall have a civil cause of action against any
- 9 person who <u>intentionally and with malice</u> intercepts, discloses
- 10 or uses or procures any other person to intercept, disclose or
- 11 use, such communication; and shall be entitled to recover from

- 13 (1) Actual damages, but not less than liquidated damages
- computed at the rate of \$100 a day for each day of violation,
- or \$1,000, whichever is higher.
