AN ACT

Amending the act of March 2, 1956 (1955 P.L.1206, No.375), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to and defining the practice of podiatry; conferring powers and imposing duties 3 on the State Board of Podiatry Examiners and the Department 5 of State; requiring licensure; providing for the granting, cancellation, suspension and revocation of licenses; 7 preserving the rights of existing licenses; providing for the promulgation of rules and regulations; transfer of 8 9 jurisdiction and records to the board; regulation of schools of chiropody and podiatry; reciprocity; and providing 10 penalties, and remedies, providing penalties for false 11 12 claims by podiatrists. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 14 15 Section 1. The act of March 2, 1956 (1955 P.L.1206, No.375), known as the "Podiatry Act of 1956," reenacted and amended 16 August 24, 1963 (P.L.1199, No.505), is amended by adding a 17 18 section to read: 19 Section 13.1. False Claims. -- Any podiatrist, whether 20 licensed or not, or any person acting as a podiatrist, who makes 21 false claims for payment shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to pay a fine of one 22

- thousand dollars (\$1,000), to make restitution of any money 1
- 2 gained through the false claim and to a suspension or revocation
- 3 of any license issued under this act for such time as the court
- 4 deems appropriate. The Attorney General shall prosecute any
- 5 person charged with making false claims for payment from public
- 6 funds.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
