AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined, " changing provisions relating to the power and duty of the Department of 21 22 Transportation on township roads.
- 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 24 hereby enacts as follows:
- 25 Section 1. Section 2006, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 26 No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," amended May
- 27 6, 1970 (P.L.356, No.120) and July 20, 1974 (P.L.569, No.196),

- 1 is amended to read:
- 2 Section 2006. Township Roads. -- The Department of
- 3 Transportation shall have the power, and its duty shall be:
- 4 [(a) To have general supervision over all township highways
- 5 and bridges constructed, improved or maintained, in whole or in
- 6 part, by the aid of State moneys, and to approve all agreements
- 7 made by township supervisors for the expenditure of moneys
- 8 appropriated by the State for road purposes;
- 9 (b) To approve plans and specifications and estimates for
- 10 the erection and repair of township bridges and culverts, and
- 11 for the construction and maintenance of township highways, but
- 12 such plans and specifications shall not be approved unless they
- 13 conform to the standards of the department, and no contract for
- 14 the repair or construction of any township bridge or culvert or
- 15 for the reconstruction of a township road shall be valid, unless
- 16 such contract is in accordance with plans prescribed or unless
- 17 plans, specifications, and estimates have been prepared or
- 18 approved by the department;]
- 19 (c) To furnish, from time to time, bulletins of instruction
- 20 to the boards of township supervisors throughout the State for
- 21 the building, repairing, maintenance, and improvement of
- 22 township roads and bridges, and to furnish any additional
- 23 information when called upon to do so. The department may also
- 24 furnish, from time to time, free of charge, standard plans and
- 25 specifications for permanent improvements in the building of
- 26 bridges and culverts, establish all grades, proper drainage, and
- 27 such other matters as may be deemed essential;
- 28 (d) To prescribe the method of keeping the township accounts
- 29 and records of moneys received and expended for highways,
- 30 machinery, bridges, tools, and implements, and for miscellaneous

- 1 purposes; from time to time to cause examination of all such
- 2 accounts and records to be made; and to furnish and supply to
- 3 the several township officers necessary blanks, forms, and
- 4 supplies, for the proper conduct of the road work of the
- 5 township, including a treasurer's book. The department shall
- 6 also furnish a treasurer's account book to each borough.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
