In the House of Representatives, March 5, 1980

1 WHEREAS, The company headed by G. William Miller before his
2 appointment as Secretary of the Treasury of the United States
3 has, as reported in the news media, admitted paying more than
4 \$5,000,000 in bribes to foreign officials and foreign business
5 persons; and

6 WHEREAS, The Office of the Secretary of the Treasury is a
7 vital and influential job helping to shape our country's
8 monetary policy; and

9 WHEREAS, The department must be cleansed of any question of
10 unethical behavior; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
12 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Attorney
13 General of the United States to appoint a special prosecutor to
14 investigate any possible wrongdoing of G. William Miller,
15 Secretary of the Treasury of the United States; and be it
