## AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the powers, privileges and immunities of military or security police of the Pennsylvania National Guard.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
б	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 51, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707,
8	No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, is
9	amended by adding a section to read:
10	<u>§ 2318. Security and military police.</u>
11	(a) General rule.
12	(1) While in the performance of official security or
13	<u>military police duties, a member of the Pennsylvania Army or</u>
14	Air National Guard who is designated and functioning as a
15	military or security police officer shall have the same power
16	and prerogatives to make arrests, with or without warrant, as
17	members of the Pennsylvania State Police.
18	(2) National Guard military and security police officers

1	shall not have the power or duty to arrest for violations of
2	75 Pa.C.S. (relating to vehicles), the act of December 15,
3	<u> 1959 (P.L.1779, No.673), known as "The Fish Law of 1959," or</u>
4	the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), known as "The
5	Game Law."
6	(b) Permissible use of force. While in the performance of
7	official security or military police duties, security and
8	military police of the Pennsylvania Army and Air National Guard
9	shall be justified in the use of force to the extent provided by
10	applicable military directives. In addition thereto, and not by
11	way of limitation thereof, the principles of justification made
12	applicable to peace officers by 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 5 (relating to
13	general principles of justification), shall apply to the
14	security or military police of the Pennsylvania Army and Air
15	National Guard while in the performance of their official
16	security or military police duties.

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SECURITY POLICE OFFICERS OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD 1 2 SHALL BE CONSIDERED POLICE OFFICERS WHEN ACTING WITHIN THE SCOPE 3 OF THEIR MILITARY POLICE OR SECURITY POLICE DUTIES AND, WHEN SO 4 ACTING, SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO ARREST FOR MILITARY-RELATED 5 OFFENSES. MILITARY POLICE AND SECURITY POLICE OFFICERS MAY MAKE ARRESTS WITHOUT WARRANT FOR MILITARY-RELATED OFFENSES WHEN: 6 7 (1) THE OFFENSE IS A SUMMARY OFFENSE, MISDEMEANOR OR 8 FELONY COMMITTED IN THE PRESENCE OF THE MILITARY POLICE OR 9 SECURITY POLICE OFFICER MAKING THE ARREST. 10 (2) THE OFFENSE IS A FELONY AND THE MILITARY POLICE OR 11 SECURITY POLICE OFFICER MAKING THE ARREST HAS PROBABLE CAUSE. 12 (B) LIMITATION. -- NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED 13 TO GIVE MILITARY POLICE OFFICERS AND SECURITY POLICE OFFICERS OF 14 THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD THE AUTHORITY TO MAKE ARRESTS 15 FOR VIOLATIONS OF TITLE 30 (RELATING TO FISH), TITLE 75 16 (RELATING TO VEHICLES), OR THE ACT OF JUNE 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, 17 NO.316), KNOWN AS "THE GAME LAW." 18 (C) PRINCIPLES OF JUSTIFICATION. --WHEN ACTING WITHIN THE 19 SCOPE OF THEIR MILITARY POLICE OR SECURITY POLICE DUTIES, 20 MILITARY POLICE AND SECURITY POLICE OFFICERS SHALL BE CONSIDERED 21 AS PEACE OFFICERS FOR PURPOSES OF THE PRINCIPLES OF 22 JUSTIFICATION SET FORTH BY 18 PA.C.S. CH.5 (RELATING TO GENERAL 23 PRINCIPLES OF JUSTIFICATION). IN ADDITION, MILITARY POLICE AND 24 SECURITY POLICE SHALL BE JUSTIFIED IN THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE TO 25 PREVENT SABOTAGE, ESPIONAGE, THEFT OR DESTRUCTION OF MILITARY 26 INFORMATION OR EQUIPMENT VITAL TO THE NATIONAL SECURITY OF THE 27 UNITED STATES. 28 (D) DEFINITIONS.--AS USED IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING 29 WORDS AND PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS 30 SUBSECTION:

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1 "MILITARY POLICE." MEMBERS OF THE PENNSYLVANIA ARMY NATIONAL 2 GUARD WHO HAVE THE MILITARY OCCUPATIONAL SPECIALITY (MOS) OF 3 MILITARY POLICE AND WHO HAVE COMPLETED MILITARY TRAINING 4 QUALIFYING THEM TO FUNCTION AS MILITARY POLICE OFFICERS. 5 "MILITARY-RELATED OFFENSE." AN OFFENSE IS CONSIDERED TO BE A MILITARY-RELATED OFFENSE FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION IF ANY OF 6 7 THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS PERTAIN TO THE OFFENSE: 8 (1) THE OFFENSE IS COMMITTED ON LANDS OR BUILDINGS BEING 9 USED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA MILITARY FORCES OR ON A PENNSYLVANIA 10 NATIONAL GUARD MILITARY INSTALLATION OR ARMORY. 11 (2) THE OFFENSE INVOLVES ANY PROPERTY, SUPPLIES OR 12 EQUIPMENT OWNED, LEASED OR ASSIGNED TO OR USED BY THE 13 PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD. 14 "SECURITY POLICE." MEMBERS OF THE PENNSYLVANIA AIR NATIONAL 15 GUARD WHO HAVE THE AIR FORCE SPECIALTY CODE (AFSC) AS SECURITY 16 OR AIR POLICE OFFICERS AND WHO HAVE COMPLETED MILITARY TRAINING 17 QUALIFYING THEM TO FUNCTION AS SECURITY POLICE OFFICERS. 18 "VITAL TO THE NATIONAL SECURITY." MILITARY PROPERTY, 19 INFORMATION AND EQUIPMENT IN POSSESSION OF THE PENNSYLVANIA 20 NATIONAL GUARD ARE CONSIDERED VITAL TO THE NATIONAL SECURITY OF 21 THE UNITED STATES WHEN DESIGNATED BY THE UNITED STATES 22 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE AS PRIORITY RESOURCES ESSENTIAL TO SUPPORT 23 THE WARTIME MISSION OF UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES OR SINGLE 24 INTEGRATED OPERATIONS PLAN OR HAVING A TOP SECRET OR MORE 25 RESTRICTIVE SECURITY CLASSIFICATION. 26 SECTION 2. SECTION 5201 OF TITLE 51 IS AMENDED BY ADDING A 27 SUBSECTION TO READ: 28 § 5201. APPREHENSION. 29 \* \* \* 30 (D) MILITARY AND SECURITY POLICE. -- A MILITARY POLICE OR
