AN ACT

- 1 Relating to the openness of standardized tests used for
- 2 admittance to higher education institutions; imposing powers
- and duties on the State Board of Education and its Council of
- 4 Higher Education; and providing penalties.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Truth in
- 9 Testing Act."
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 As used in this act, the following words and phrases shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section, unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise.
- 14 "Board." The State Board of Education and its Council of
- 15 Higher Education to the extent the board determines.
- 16 "Standardized test" or "test." Any form of a test given at
- 17 the test subject's expense, which is machine scored and is
- 18 designed for use or used in the process of post-secondary or

- 1 professional school admissions. This definition shall also
- 2 include all preliminary or preparatory tests including, but not
- 3 limited to the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test. This
- 4 definition shall not be construed to include any local, State or
- 5 Federal Civil Service test, any test designed and used solely
- 6 for nonadmission placement or credit or any test administered by
- 7 an individual institution solely for its own purposes.
- 8 "Test agency." Any organization, association, corporation,
- 9 partnership or individual who develops, sponsors or administers
- 10 a test. This definition shall not be construed to include any
- 11 organization, association, corporation, partnership or
- 12 individual that solely provides space or proctoring services for
- 13 the administration of a test.
- 14 "Test results" or "test scores." The evaluation of a test
- 15 subject's performance on a test, as determined by the test
- 16 agency.
- 17 "Test subject." Any individual to whom a test is
- 18 administered within the Commonwealth.
- 19 Section 3. Filing by test agency.
- The test agency shall file with the board a copy of any
- 21 study, evaluation or report that pertains to the reliability,
- 22 validity, bias, standard deviation or any other quality of a
- 23 test administered in this Commonwealth. If any such material
- 24 submitted contains any information identifiable with an
- 25 individual test subject, that information shall be expunged from
- 26 the material prior to submission. All such materials submitted
- 27 shall be a matter of public record.
- 28 Section 4. Submission of copies of test questions and answers.
- 29 (a) Within 30 days after the results of any test have been
- 30 released, the test agency shall submit to the board:

- 1 (1) A copy of all test questions used in computing the
- 2 test subject's raw score.
- 3 (2) A copy of the corresponding acceptable answers.
- 4 (3) All rules used to transfer raw scores into those
- 5 scores reported to the test subjects, together with an
- 6 explanation of such rules.
- 7 (b) All such information submitted shall be a matter of
- 8 public record.
- 9 Section 5. Information for test subjects.
- 10 (a) After the test has been filed with the board and upon
- 11 the request of a test subject, tendered within 90 days after the
- 12 test results have been released, the test agency shall send to
- 13 the test subject:
- 14 (1) A copy of the test questions used to determine the
- 15 test subject's raw score.
- 16 (2) A copy of the test subject's individual answer
- sheet, together with a copy of the acceptable answers to that
- 18 test with the questions used to determine the test subject's
- 19 raw score appropriately marked.
- 20 (3) A statement of the raw score used to calculate the
- 21 test results already received by the test subject, together
- 22 with the rules used for transforming the raw score into the
- 23 reported test results.
- 24 (b) A test agency may deny a request from a test subject
- 25 received more than 90 days after the test results have been
- 26 released to the test subject.
- 27 (c) The test agency may charge a nominal fee for the
- 28 processing of such information not to exceed the actual cost of
- 29 processing.
- 30 Section 6. Information for prospective test subjects.

- 1 A test agency shall furnish a prospective test subject the
- 2 following information attached to the registration form:
- 3 (1) The purpose for which the test is constructed,
- 4 together with the subject matter of the test and the
- 5 knowledge and skills the test purports to measure.
- 6 (2) Statements in clear, nontechnical language designed
- 7 to facilitate the test subject's understanding of the methods
- 8 of reporting test results and the rules for transforming and
- 9 interpreting the raw scores into the test results received by
- 10 the test subject, including the reliability and standard
- 11 error of measurement of the test and the predictive validity
- of the test including correlations between test scores and
- the test subject's future academic performance.
- 14 (3) A complete description of any promises or covenants
- that the test agency makes to the test subject with regard to
- 16 accuracy of scoring, timely forwarding of information,
- 17 policies for notifying the test subject regarding
- inaccuracies in scoring or score reporting and privacy of
- information relating to the test subject.
- 20 (4) Statements in regard to whether or not the test
- 21 results are the property of the test subject, the length of
- 22 time the test agency will retain the individual test
- 23 subject's results and the policies regarding storage,
- 24 disposal and future use of test result data.
- 25 (5) A complete description of the test subject's
- opportunity to request information pursuant to section 5,
- 27 together with the amount of the fee charged for such
- 28 material.
- 29 Section 7. Confidentiality.
- 30 Unless specifically authorized by the test subject, or the

- 1 parent or guardian if the test subject is a minor, the test
- 2 agency shall not release or disclose the test results of any
- 3 test subject to any person, organization, corporation,
- 4 association, college, university or governmental agency or
- 5 subdivision. A test agency may, however, release all previous
- 6 results received by a test subject on a test to anyone
- 7 designated by the test subject to receive the current results.
- 8 This section shall not be construed to prohibit the release of
- 9 test results and other information in possession of the test
- 10 agency for the purposes of research leading to studies and
- 11 reports concerning the tests themselves. Any information
- 12 directly identifiable with any individual test subject shall be
- 13 expunged from the material prior to its disclosure.
- 14 Section 8. Rules and regulations.
- 15 The board shall promulgate regulations to implement the
- 16 provisions of this act.
- 17 Section 9. Penalties.
- 18 Any test agency which violates any provision of this act is
- 19 guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall
- 20 pay a fine of \$300 for each violation.
- 21 Section 10. Effective date.
- 22 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
