## AN ACT

1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for 3 limitations on governmental immunity. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 8542(b)(6) of Title 42, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, added October 5, 1980 (P.L.693, No.142), is amended to read: 10 § 8542. Exceptions to governmental immunity. 11 (b) Acts which may impose liability. -- The following acts by 12 13 a local agency or any of its employees may result in the imposition of liability on a local agency: 14 15 16 (6) Streets.--17 (i) A dangerous condition of streets owned by the

local agency, except that the claimant to recover must

1 establish that the dangerous condition created a reasonably foreseeable risk of the kind of injury which 2. 3 was incurred and that the local agency had actual notice or could reasonably be charged with notice under the 4 5 circumstances of the dangerous condition at a sufficient time prior to the event to have taken measures to protect against the dangerous condition. 7

> (ii) No local agency, nor any officer or employee thereof, shall be liable for a dangerous condition of streets or highways under the jurisdiction of Commonwealth agencies unless the local agency has entered into a contract with a Commonwealth agency wherein the <u>local agency expressly agrees to assume responsibility</u> for maintenance or repairs of such streets or highways. If a local agency executes such a contract, the provisions of subparagraph (i) relating to reasonably foreseeable risk and notice to the local agency shall apply.
