## AN ACT

- 1 To apportion the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania into congressional
- 2 districts in conformity with constitutional requirements,
- 3 providing for the nomination and election of Congressmen and
- 4 making a repeal.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Districts.
- 8 For the purpose of electing representatives of the people of
- 9 Pennsylvania to serve in the House of Representatives in the
- 10 Congress of the United States, this Commonwealth shall be
- 11 divided into twenty-three districts which shall have one
- 12 Congressman each, as follows:
- The First District shall consist of Wards 1, 2, 5, 7, 14, 15,
- 14 18, 19, 23, 25, 26, 31, 33, 39, 40, 41, 42 (Divisions 1, 22 and

- 14 Total population: 515,626.
- 15 Section 2. Procedure.
- 16 (a) First election. -- The first election under this act shall
- 17 be held at the primary election in the year 1982.
- 18 (b) Current members of Congress.--The members of Congress
- 19 now in office shall continue in such office until the expiration
- 20 of their respective terms.
- 21 (c) Vacancies. -- Vacancies now existing or occurring after
- 22 the passage of this act and before the commencement of the terms
- 23 of the members elected at the election of 1982 shall be filled
- 24 for the unexpired terms in the manner provided by law.
- 25 Section 3. Construction of act.
- 26 In the event any political subdivision or part thereof in the
- 27 City of Philadelphia or County of Allegheny should be omitted in
- 28 the description of the congressional districts, such political
- 29 subdivision or part thereof shall be included as a part of the
- 30 congressional district which completely surrounds it. Should any

- 1 omitted political subdivision or part thereof be not completely
- 2 surrounded by one congressional district, it shall become a part
- 3 of that congressional district in the City of Philadelphia or
- 4 County of Allegheny to which it is contiguous, or if there are
- 5 two or more such contiguous districts, it shall become a part of
- 6 that congressional district contiguous thereto which is located
- 7 in the City of Philadelphia or County of Allegheny and which has
- 8 the least population.
- 9 Section 4. Repeal.
- 10 (a) Specific repeal.--The act of January 25, 1972 (P.L.7,
- 11 No.3), entitled "An act to apportion the Commonwealth of
- 12 Pennsylvania into congressional districts in conformity with
- 13 constitutional requirements; and providing for the nomination
- 14 and election of Congressmen," is repealed.
- 15 (b) General repeal.--All acts or parts of acts inconsistent
- 16 herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- 17 Section 5. Effective date.
- 18 This act shall take effect immediately.
