AN ACT

Amending the act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.450, No.291), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to fires and fire prevention; 3 imposing duties and conferring powers upon the Pennsylvania State Police; authorizing the appointment of the chiefs of 5 fire departments and certain public officers and others as assistants to the Pennsylvania State Police, and defining 7 their powers and duties; providing for the investigation of the cause, origin, and circumstance of fires and the 8 9 inspection of all, and the removal or change of, certain 10 buildings by owners and occupants thereof, including political subdivisions; imposing duties on school authorities 11 and on certain corporations, associations, and fire rating 12 agencies; providing for the attendance of witnesses before 13 14 the Pennsylvania State Police, and the enforcement of its 15 orders; and prescribing penalties, " providing for the residential storage of kerosene, fuel oil and diesel fuel. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 18 19 Section 1, act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.450, Section 1. 20 No.291), referred to as the State Fire Marshal Law, amended 21 February 17, 1972 (P.L.72, No.24), is amended to read: 22 Section 1. [Be it enacted, &c., That the] (a) The 23 Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police may appoint and

remove the chief of the fire department of any county, city,

- 2 to the department, and, when so appointed, shall be subject to
- 3 the obligations imposed by this act and to the authority of the
- 4 Pennsylvania State Police.
- 5 (b) The Pennsylvania State Police may adopt and enforce
- 6 rules and regulations governing the having, using, storage,
- 7 sale, and keeping of gasoline, naphtha, kerosene, fuel oil, or
- 8 other substance of like character. These regulations shall not
- 9 prohibit the storage of no more than two hundred seventy-five
- 10 gallons of kerosene, fuel oil or diesel fuel on the premises of
- 11 <u>a one to three-family residential dwelling where the storage</u>
- 12 <u>site is at least twenty feet from the dwelling, providing that</u>
- 13 the requirements of subsection (c) have been met.
- 14 (c) (1) Any person who desires to store kerosene, fuel oil
- 15 or diesel fuel for his personal or residential use in an amount
- 16 to exceed ten gallons shall first obtain a permit from the local
- 17 <u>fire protection agency</u>. Application for this permit shall be
- 18 made on a form as prescribed by the State Fire Marshal.
- 19 (2) The kerosene, fuel oil or diesel fuel shall be stored in
- 20 <u>a container which shall rest directly on a suitable foundation</u>
- 21 or supports of concrete, masonry or steel so as to be free from
- 22 the danger of any accidental spillage or tipping.
- 23 (3) The container shall have its opening located only on the
- 24 top.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
