In the House of Representatives, May 11, 1981

- 1 Bobby Sands, the 27-year old Northern Ireland freedom fighter
- 2 died on May 5, 1981 in the 66th day of his hunger strike at the
- 3 Maze Prison near Belfast.
- 4 The British refused to grant Sands, who was a member of the
- 5 British Parliament, his request to be given political prisoner
- 6 status even though they knew that he was near death.
- 7 Many Americans feel that the denial of Sands' request was a
- 8 denial of his human rights and that it is a disgrace to allow a
- 9 man to die for his beliefs.
- 10 Since there are three other Irish, who are also fasting, it
- 11 is time that the British are made aware of the feelings of the
- 12 members of the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
- 13 Pennsylvania; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urges the British Government to at

- 1 least negotiate with the Irish Nationalists with an aim of
- 2 settling their differences without additional deaths; and be it
- 3 further
- 4 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the
- 5 British Ambassador in Washington and Prime Minister Margaret
- 6 Thatcher.
