In the House of Representatives, May 12, 1981

- 1 WHEREAS, A certain organization which is known as the Ku Klux
- 2 Klan, is anti-Jewish, anti-Catholic, and anti-black; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A report in the Paxton Herald recounted an incident
- 4 where some of the members of a motorcycle gang who assaulted
- 5 three Pennsylvania State Police Officers were wearing Ku Klux
- 6 Klan emblems and Nazi swastikas; and
- WHEREAS, There have been numerous cross burnings throughout
- 8 the Commonwealth at the homes and institutions of blacks,
- 9 including Lincoln University; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives of
- 11 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania appoint five members of the
- 12 House, three of whom shall be from the Majority Party and two of
- 13 whom shall be from the Minority Party, to a select committee to
- 14 investigate the activities of the Ku Klux Klan and any
- 15 organization or persons associated with the Ku Klux Klan; and be
- 16 it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take

- 1 testimony, and make its investigations at such places as it
- 2 deems necessary; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings to the House 3
- 4 of Representatives as soon as possible.
