In the House of Representatives, November 9, 1981

1 WHEREAS, Many areas of the Commonwealth have suffered damage
2 due to coal mining, poor highway drainage and other natural and
3 man-made causes, and

4 WHEREAS, It would be beneficial to our youth and to the
5 Commonwealth to have a conservation camp program similar to the
6 old Civilian Conservation Corps to work on restoring our land
7 and its natural resources; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
9 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby memorializes the Congress of
10 the United States to enact legislation reestablishing the
11 Civilian Conservation Corps; and be it further

12 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be immediately
13 transmitted to every member of the Congressional Delegation from
14 Pennsylvania.
