AN ACT

1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
2 act relating to the public school system, including certain
3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
5 laws relating thereto," extending the reporting period to the
6 Secretary of Revenue for personal income information.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 ~~Section 1. Section 2514.1(a) of the act of March 10, 1949~~ <—
10 ~~(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,~~
11 ~~amended February 4, 1982 (P.L.1, No.1), is amended to read:~~

12 SECTION 1. SECTION 922.1-A(E) OF THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 <—
13 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949, ADDED
14 AUGUST 1, 1975 (P.L.180, NO.89), IS AMENDED TO READ:

15 SECTION 922.1-A. AUXILIARY SERVICES.--* * *

16 (E) LIMITATIONS. THE INTERMEDIATE UNIT SHALL NOT USE MORE
17 THAN SIX PER CENTUM (6%) OF THE FUNDS IT RECEIVES FOR
18 ADMINISTRATION OR EIGHTEEN PER CENTUM (18%) FOR RENTAL OF
19 FACILITIES. THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL NOT USE MORE THAN

1 ONE PER CENTUM (1%) OF THE FUNDS IT ALLOCATES UNDER THIS SECTION
2 FOR ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES. IF ALL FUNDS ALLOCATED BY THE
3 INTERMEDIATE UNITS TO ADMINISTRATION, OR RENTAL FACILITIES ARE
4 NOT EXPENDED FOR THOSE PURPOSES, SUCH FUNDS MAY BE USED FOR THE
5 PROGRAM COSTS. AT THE END OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR ALL UNEXPENDED
6 FUNDS SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE COMMONWEALTH. ALL SUCH FUNDS
7 RETURNED ARE HEREBY SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED TO THE SECRETARY
8 OF EDUCATION FOR THE SUPPORT OF AUXILIARY SERVICES FOR NONPUBLIC
9 SCHOOL STUDENTS.

11 SECTION 2. SECTION 2514.1(A) OF THE ACT, AMENDED FEBRUARY 4,
12 1982 (P.L.1, NO.1), IS AMENDED TO READ:

13 Section 2514.1. Personal Income Valuation Information and
14 Determinations.--(a) The Secretary of Revenue shall, on or
15 before January 31 of each year commencing in 1981, supply to
16 each school district a listing of the names and addresses of
17 each person who has filed a State income tax return with the
18 Department of Revenue for the tax year preceding the immediate
19 prior year and has designated thereon a code or identification
20 number indicating that the taxpayer was a resident of the school
21 district at the close of the tax year for which the return was
22 filed. Within [twenty (20)] twenty-five (25) days of receipt of
23 the list, each school district shall report to the Secretary of
24 Revenue in writing in such form as the secretary shall prescribe
25 any claimed corrections to the list as of December 31 of the tax
26 year for which the returns were filed, specifying the basis for
27 each claim. Should the school district claim that any address
28 listed properly should be carried upon the list of another
29 school district, the reporting school district shall notify the
30 other school district of its claim, and a copy of the notice

1 shall accompany the report hereby required. Within ten (10) days
2 of receipt of the notice, the other school district may notify
3 the Secretary of Revenue in writing in such form as the
4 secretary shall prescribe of its nonconcurrence with the claim
5 made by the reporting school district, specifying the basis for
6 its nonconcurrence. Failure to report or notify the Secretary of
7 Revenue of any claimed correction or nonconcurrence as herein
8 provided shall be deemed a concurrence.

10 Section 2 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
