7	Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 8337. Telephone company, civil and criminal immunity.
10	(a) Good faith cooperation to be a defenseGood faith
11	cooperation by a telephone company with the request of a law
12	enforcement official to reroute or divert telephone lines for
13	the purpose of limiting communications in emergency situations
14	shall be a complete defense to any criminal or civil action
15	against the telephone company arising from that cooperation.
16	(b) DefinitionsAs used in this section the following
17	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
18	subsection:

- 1 <u>"Emergency situation." Any situation in which it is</u>
- 2 reasonably believed that hostages have been taken or life is
- 3 threatened by the unlawful actions of any individual.
- 4 <u>"Law enforcement official." The Attorney General, a district</u>
- 5 attorney or any State or local police.
- 6 <u>"Telephone company." Includes employees of telephone</u>
- 7 <u>companies.</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
