Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the use of fingerprints and photographs.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
nereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Section 6308(c) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
§ 6308. Law enforcement records.
* * *
(c) Fingerprints and photographs
(1) Law enforcement officers shall have the authority to
take or cause to be taken the fingerprints or photographs, or
both, of any child 15 years of age and older who is alleged
to have committed a delinquent act that, but for the
application of this chapter, would constitute a felony or a
violation of Subchapter A of Chapter 61 of Title 18 (relating
to uniform firearms act).
violation of Subchapter A of Chapter 61 of Title

18 (2) Fingerprint and photographic records [shall not] <u>may</u>

be disseminated to law enforcement officers of other
jurisdictions, the Pennsylvania State Police [or] and the
Federal Bureau of Investigation [unless] only for
<u>investigative purposes or if</u> so ordered by the court.

5 (3) Fingerprints and photographic records of children 6 shall be immediately destroyed by all persons and agencies 7 having these records if the child is not adjudicated 8 delinquent for reason of the alleged acts.

9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
