## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, limiting the defense of justification in certain cases.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 509(3) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 509. Use of force by persons with special responsibility for
9	care, discipline or safety of others.
10	The use of force upon or toward the person of another is
11	justifiable if:
12	* * *
13	(3) (i) The actor is the guardian or other person
14	similarly responsible for the general care and
15	supervision of an incompetent, mentally ill or mentally
16	<pre>retarded person; and:</pre>
17	[(i)] (A) the force is used for the purpose of
18	safeguarding or promoting the welfare of the

1	incompetent, mentally ill or mentally retarded
2	person, including the prevention of his misconduct,
3	or, when such [incompetent] person is in a hospital
4	or other institution for his care and custody, for
5	the maintenance of reasonable discipline in such
6	institution; and
7	$[(ii)]$ $\underline{(B)}$ the force used is not designed to
8	cause or known to create a substantial risk of
9	causing death, serious bodily injury, disfigurement,
10	extreme or unnecessary pain, mental distress, or
11	humiliation.
12	(ii) Notwithstanding subparagraph (i), the use of
13	force by persons employed at facilities operated or
14	licensed by the Department of Public Welfare as
15	residential programs for mentally ill or mentally
16	retarded persons is not justifiable if the force used is
17	in violation of the standards established by regulations
18	of the department.

20	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
