AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto, " limiting the power of local school 6 boards over the admission of students on the basis of age. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 1304 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 10 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended January 14, 1970 (1969 P.L.468, No.192), is amended to read: 11 12 Section 1304. Admission of Beginners. -- (a) The admission of beginners to the public schools shall be confined to the first 13 two weeks of the annual school term in districts operating on an 14 15 annual promotion basis, and to the first two weeks of either the
- 16 first or the second semester of the school term in districts
- 17 operating on a semi-annual promotion basis. Admission shall be
- 18 limited to beginners who have attained the age of five years and
- 19 seven months before the first day of September if they are to be

- 1 admitted in the fall, and to those who have attained the age of
- 2 five years and seven months before the first day of February if
- 3 they are to be admitted at the beginning of the second semester.
- 4 The board of school directors of any school district may admit
- 5 beginners who are less than five years and seven months of age,
- 6 in accordance with standards prescribed by the State Board of
- 7 Education. The board of school directors of any school district
- 8 <u>shall admit beginners who have completed the kindergarten level</u>
- 9 <u>or its equivalent in another state.</u> The board of school
- 10 directors may refuse to accept or retain beginners who have not
- 11 attained a mental age of five years, as determined by the
- 12 supervisor of special education or a properly certificated
- 13 public school psychologist in accordance with standards
- 14 prescribed by the State Board of Education. No board of school
- 15 <u>directors of any school district may refuse to accept or retain</u>
- 16 beginners for any other reason.
- 17 <u>(b)</u> The term "beginners," as used in this section, shall
- 18 mean any child that should enter the lowest grade of the primary
- 19 school or the lowest primary class above the kindergarten level.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
