AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 commissions shall be determined, " requiring the Department of 20 21 General Services to purchase vehicles equipped with air bags 22 and make a report; and making editorial changes.
- 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 24 hereby enacts as follows:
- 25 Section 1. Section 515 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 26 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended to
- 27 read:

- 1 Section 515. Automobiles.--All automobiles required for the
- 2 proper conduct of the business of the several administrative
- 3 departments, boards, and commissions, shall be purchased and
- 4 maintained by or under the supervision of the Department of
- 5 [Property and Supplies] General Services, except that the
- 6 Department of [Highways] <u>Transportation</u> may continue to maintain
- 7 automobiles purchased for it by the Department of [Property and
- 8 Supplies] <u>General Services</u> as purchasing agency. <u>All vehicles</u>
- 9 purchased by the Department of General Services after July 1,
- 10 1985, shall be equipped with air bags. A report on the effect of
- 11 the air bag restraint system on the rate of injury and death
- 12 <u>resulting from vehicle accidents shall be made by the Department</u>
- 13 of General Services to the Senate and House Committees on
- 14 Transportation at the conclusion of each fiscal year. The report
- 15 shall be distributed to all members of the Senate and House of
- 16 Representatives within thirty (30) days.
- 17 Section 2. Section 2407 of the act, amended June 3, 1943
- 18 (P.L.833, No.352), February 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1080, No.350) and
- 19 December 18, 1968 (P.L.1232, No.390), is amended to read:
- 20 Section 2407. Automobiles.--The Department of [Property and
- 21 Supplies] General Services shall, upon the effective date of
- 22 this act, take over, and thereafter assume responsibility for,
- 23 the maintenance and operation of all automobiles owned by the
- 24 Commonwealth, or any administrative department, board, or
- 25 commission thereof, except the Department of [Highways]
- 26 <u>Transportation</u>.
- 27 After the effective date of this act, all automobiles
- 28 required for use by the administrative departments, boards,
- 29 commissions, and officers of the State Government, shall be
- 30 purchased by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General

- 1 <u>Services</u>, but, in purchasing automobiles required for the use of
- 2 any department, board, or commission, having authority to
- 3 purchase automobiles out of money appropriated to it, the
- 4 Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services shall act
- 5 as purchasing agency.
- 6 The Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services
- 7 shall make or contract for the making of all repairs to
- 8 automobiles owned by the Commonwealth, except those operated by
- 9 the Department of [Highways] <u>Transportation</u>, unless in any case
- 10 it shall specifically authorize any department, board,
- 11 commission, or officer, to make or order the making of repairs
- 12 to any specified automobiles, and, except emergency repairs
- 13 necessarily made while any automobile is away from its garage.
- 14 The Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services
- 15 may assign to any department, board, or commission, such
- 16 automobiles as may be required by it for full-time daily use,
- 17 and such automobiles shall be operated by employes of such
- 18 departments, boards, or commissions. The department shall
- 19 maintain a sufficient number of automobiles, not assigned to
- 20 departments, boards, or commissions, to meet the requirements of
- 21 departments, boards, and commissions which do not require the
- 22 full-time daily use of automobiles, and to meet extraordinary
- 23 and occasional demands of all departments, boards, and
- 24 commissions, other than the Department of [Highways]
- 25 Transportation. Such automobiles with or without chauffeurs,
- 26 shall be furnished to departments, boards, or commissions, upon
- 27 requisition of the heads of the respective departments, or of
- 28 the executive officers of the respective boards or commissions.
- 29 This paragraph shall not be construed to prohibit a State
- 30 officer or employe from being reimbursed for the use of his own

- 1 automobile on State business, but all such reimbursements shall
- 2 be made under and subject to the rules of the Executive Board
- 3 regulating the payment of expenses to State officers and
- 4 employes.
- 5 The cost of oil, gasoline, tires, repair parts for and
- 6 repairs to automobiles permanently assigned to departments,
- 7 boards, and commissions, shall be paid out of the appropriations
- 8 to such departments, boards, and commissions, but the Department
- 9 of [Property and Supplies] General Services shall contract for
- 10 all such oil, gasoline, tires, repair parts, and repairs, except
- 11 that repairs may be made by the Department of [Highways]
- 12 <u>Transportation</u>, and, if authorized as hereinbefore provided, by
- 13 other departments and by boards and commissions. For the use of
- 14 other automobiles, departments, boards, and commissions shall be
- 15 billed by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General
- 16 <u>Services</u>, upon a mileage basis, at such amount per mile as the
- 17 Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services, with the
- 18 approval of the Governor, shall determine. Amounts payable for
- 19 the use of such automobiles shall be paid out of the
- 20 appropriations to such departments, boards, or commissions to
- 21 the Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services, and
- 22 shall be, by it, paid into the General Fund of the State
- 23 Treasury, through the Department of Revenue.
- 24 The Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services
- 25 shall require every administrative department, including the
- 26 Department of [Highways] <u>Transportation</u>, and every independent
- 27 administrative and departmental administrative board or
- 28 commission, to report to it monthly, upon forms supplied by it,
- 29 and with such detail as it shall require, the places to and from
- 30 which each automobile was operated, the mileage traveled, the

- 1 amount of oil and gasoline purchased, the names of employes of
- 2 the department, board, or commission operating each automobile,
- 3 the names of the employes of the department, board, or
- 4 commission for whom the automobiles were operated, and such
- 5 other information as may be necessary to enable the Department
- 6 of [Property and Supplies] General Services to make and keep
- 7 complete records of the use and cost of operation of all State
- 8 automobiles, except that it shall not be necessary for the
- 9 Department of the Auditor General, the Treasury Department, or
- 10 the Pennsylvania State Police, to report the places to and from
- 11 which, or the names of the persons by or for whom automobiles
- 12 were operated.
- 13 The types and number of automobiles to be purchased by the
- 14 Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services hereunder
- 15 shall be subject to approval by the Executive Board, and the use
- 16 of automobiles by State officers and employes shall be subject
- 17 to the rules and regulations of the Executive Board.
- 18 All vehicles purchased by the Department of General Services
- 19 after July 1, 1985, shall be equipped with air bags. A report on
- 20 the effect of the air bag restraint system on the rate of injury
- 21 and death resulting from vehicle accidents shall be made by the
- 22 Department of General Services to the Senate and House
- 23 <u>Committees on Transportation at the conclusion of each fiscal</u>
- 24 year. The report shall be distributed to all members of the
- 25 <u>Senate and House of Representatives within thirty (30) days.</u>
- 26 Subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners of
- 27 Public Grounds and Buildings, the Department of [Property and
- 28 Supplies] General Services may sell automobiles, owned by the
- 29 Commonwealth, when it deems it is in the public interest to do
- 30 so. The proceeds of such sales shall be paid into the State

- 1 Treasury, shall be credited to the appropriation to the
- 2 department for the purchase of automobiles, or to any
- 3 department, board or commission having authority to purchase
- 4 automobiles with money appropriated to it, and are hereby
- 5 appropriated to the respective department, board or commission
- 6 for the purchase of automobiles.
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
