AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the powers,
- 3 privileges and immunities of military or security police of
- 4 the Pennsylvania National Guard.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 2318. Military and security police.
- 10 (a) Powers and duties. -- Military police officers and
- 11 security police officers of the Pennsylvania National Guard
- 12 shall be considered police officers when acting within the scope
- 13 of their military police or security police duties and, when so
- 14 acting, shall have the power to arrest for military-related
- 15 offenses. Military police and security police officers may make
- 16 arrests without warrant for military-related offenses when:
- 17 (1) The offense is a summary offense, misdemeanor or
- 18 felony committed in the presence of the military police or

- 1 <u>security police officer making the arrest.</u>
- 2 (2) The offense is a felony and the military police or
- 3 <u>security police officer making the arrest has probable cause.</u>
- 4 (b) Limitation. -- Nothing in this section shall be construed
- 5 to give military police officers and security police officers of
- 6 the Pennsylvania National Guard the authority to make arrests
- 7 for violations of Title 30 (relating to fish) or 75 (relating to
- 8 vehicles) or the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), known
- 9 <u>as The Game Law.</u>
- 10 (c) Principles of justification. -- When acting within the
- 11 scope of their military police or security police duties,
- 12 <u>military police and security police officers shall be considered</u>
- 13 peace officers for purposes of the principles of justification
- 14 set forth by 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 5 (relating to general principles of
- 15 <u>justification</u>). In addition, military police and security police
- 16 shall be justified in the use of deadly force to prevent
- 17 sabotage, espionage, theft or destruction of military
- 18 information or equipment vital to the national security of the
- 19 United States.
- 20 (d) Definitions.--As used in this section the following
- 21 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 22 subsection:
- 23 "Military police." Members of the Pennsylvania Army National
- 24 Guard who have the Military Occupational Speciality (MOS) of
- 25 <u>military police and who have completed military training</u>
- 26 qualifying them to function as military police officers.
- 27 "Military-related offense." An offense for which any of the
- 28 <u>following conditions are applicable:</u>
- 29 (1) The offense is committed on lands or buildings being
- 30 used by the Pennsylvania military forces or on a Pennsylvania

- 1 <u>National Guard military installation or armory.</u>
- 2 (2) The offense involves any property, supplies or
- 3 equipment owned, leased or assigned to or used by the
- 4 <u>Pennsylvania National Guard.</u>
- 5 <u>"Security police." Members of the Pennsylvania Air National</u>
- 6 Guard who have the Air Force Specialty Code (AFSC) as security
- 7 or air police officers and who have completed military training
- 8 qualifying them to function as security police officers.
- 9 <u>"Vital to the national security." Military property,</u>
- 10 <u>information and equipment in possession of the Pennsylvania</u>
- 11 National Guard which are designated by the United States
- 12 <u>Department of Defense as priority resources essential to support</u>
- 13 the wartime mission of United States armed forces or single
- 14 <u>integrated operations plan or having a top secret or more</u>
- 15 restrictive security classification.
- 16 Section 2. Section 5201 of Title 51 is amended by adding a
- 17 subsection to read:
- 18 § 5201. Apprehension.
- 19 * * *
- 20 (d) Military and security police. -- A military police or
- 21 <u>security police officer of the Pennsylvania National Guard as</u>
- 22 defined in section 2318 (relating to military and security
- 23 police), in a duty status as defined in section 5101 (relating
- 24 to definitions) and while performing assigned duties pursuant to
- 25 <u>lawful orders, may apprehend any member of the Pennsylvania</u>
- 26 National Guard for any offense specified in Part IV (relating to
- 27 military justice).
- 28 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
