AN ACT

- Amending the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.847, No.356), entitled "An act relating to and regulating the business of banking and the exercise by corporations of fiduciary powers; 3 affecting persons engaged in the business of banking and 5 corporations exercising fiduciary powers and affiliates of such persons; affecting the shareholders of such persons and 6 7 the directors, trustees, officers, attorneys and employes of such persons and of the affiliates of such persons; affecting 9 national banks located in the Commonwealth; affecting persons dealing with persons engaged in the business of banking, 10 corporations exercising fiduciary powers and national banks; 11 12 conferring powers and imposing duties on the Banking Board, 13 on certain departments and officers of the Commonwealth and 14 on courts, prothonotaries, clerks and recorders of deeds; 15 providing penalties; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts," making Columbus Day a fixed holiday. 16
