## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and
- 2 Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 3 Statutes, increasing certain penalties; and providing minimum
- 4 terms for certain sexual offenses.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Sections 3122, 3126 and 3127 of Title 18 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 9 § 3122. Statutory rape.
- 10 A person who is 18 years of age or older commits statutory
- 11 rape, a felony of the [second] first degree, when he engages in
- 12 sexual intercourse with another person not his spouse who is
- 13 less than 14 years of age. The minimum term of imprisonment for
- 14 a first offense shall be five years and for a second or
- 15 subsequent offense shall be life imprisonment.
- 16 § 3126. Indecent assault.
- 17 A person who has indecent contact with another not his
- 18 spouse[,] or causes such other to have indecent contact with him

- 1 is guilty of indecent assault, a misdemeanor of the second
- 2 degree unless the other person is less than 16 years of age in
- 3 which case it is a felony of the first degree, if:
- 4 (1) he does so without the consent of the other person;
- 5 (2) he knows that the other person suffers from a mental
- 6 disease or defect which renders him or her incapable of
- 7 appraising the nature of his or her conduct;
- 8 (3) he knows that the other person is unaware that a
- 9 indecent contact is being committed;
- 10 (4) he has substantially impaired the other person's
- 11 power to appraise or control his or her conduct, by
- administering or employing without the knowledge of the other
- drugs, intoxicants or other means for the purpose of
- 14 preventing resistance; or
- 15 (5) the other person is in custody of law or detained in
- 16 a hospital or other institution and the actor has supervisory
- or disciplinary authority over him.
- 18 § 3127. Indecent exposure.
- 19 A person commits a misdemeanor of the second degree if, for
- 20 the purpose of arousing or gratifying sexual desire of himself
- 21 or of any person other than his spouse, he exposes his genitals
- 22 under circumstances in which he knows his conduct is likely to
- 23 cause affront or alarm unless the person to whom he exposes
- 24 himself is less than 16 years of age in which case the person
- 25 commits a felony of the second degree.
- 26 Section 2. Section 9718 of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 27 § 9718. Sentences for offenses against infant persons.
- 28 (a) Mandatory sentence. -- A person convicted of the following
- 29 offenses when the victim is under 16 years of age or, in the
- 30 case of statutory rape, under 14 years of age shall be sentenced

- 1 to a mandatory term of imprisonment as follows:
- 2 18 Pa.C.S. § 2702(a)(1) and (4) (relating to aggravated
- 3 assault) not less than two years.
- 4 18 Pa.C.S. § 3121 (relating to rape) not less than five
- 5 years.
- 6 <u>18 Pa.C.S. § 3122 (relating to statutory rape) not less</u>
- 7 than five years for a first offense and life imprisonment for
- 8 <u>a second or subsequent offense.</u>
- 9 18 Pa.C.S. § 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual
- intercourse) not less than five years for a first offense
- and life imprisonment for a second or subsequent offense.
- 12 <u>18 Pa.C.S. § 3126 (relating to indecent assault) not</u>
- less than five years for a first offense and life
- imprisonment for a second or subsequent offense.
- 15 <u>18 Pa.C.S. § 3127 (relating to indecent exposure) not</u>
- less than five years for a second or subsequent offense.
- 17 (b) Eligibility for parole.--Parole shall not be granted
- 18 until the minimum term of imprisonment has been served.
- 19 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
