AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 commissions shall be determined, " creating a limited 21 preference for certain bidders; and making repeals. 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 24 25 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a 26 section to read:
- 27 Section 2002.1. Preference for Resident Vendors. -- In any

- 1 instance where a purchase of services, equipment or materials by
- 2 the Department of Transportation is required to be made upon a
- 3 competitive basis, such purchase shall, notwithstanding any
- 4 provision of law requiring that the purchase be made from the
- 5 lowest responsible bidder, be made from a resident vendor in
- 6 Pennsylvania, if the bid of the resident vendor does not exceed
- 7 the lowest qualified bid from a nonresident vendor by more than
- 8 ten per centum (10%) of the latter bid. A vendor shall be deemed
- 9 <u>a resident of this Commonwealth if the vendor is an individual,</u>
- 10 partnership, association or corporation maintaining an active
- 11 bona fide place of business within this Commonwealth. The
- 12 <u>section shall not be applicable when its application may</u>
- 13 jeopardize the receipt of Federal funds.
- 14 Section 2. (a) The following acts and parts of acts are
- 15 repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this act:
- 16 Section 404 of the act of June 1, 1945 (P.L.1242, No.428),
- 17 known as the State Highway Law.
- 18 Section 2 of the act of November 26, 1978 (P.L.1309, No.317),
- 19 referred to as the Public Works Contract Regulation Law.
- 20 (b) All other acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as
- 21 they are inconsistent with this act.
- 22 Section 3. This act shall apply to contracts awarded under
- 23 invitations to bid issued after the effective date of this act.
- 24 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
