## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Promoting the hiring of welfare recipients for entry-level positions in State government; providing for the establishment of a public service training program and a State-related employment training fund for welfare recipients; providing for grants to State contractors and providers of services; and making appropriations.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Legislative findings and declaration of policy.
10	(a) FindingsThe General Assembly finds and declares that:
11	(1) The Commonwealth expends millions of dollars
12	annually to provide services for Pennsylvania citizens,
13	particularly the elderly, the sick and the mentally or
14	physically handicapped.
15	(2) These expenditures directly and indirectly create
16	jobs for many Pennsylvanians.
17	(3) At the same time, thousands of needy individuals and

families are dependent on cash welfare assistance because
 they lack adequate job skills and employment opportunities.

3 (4) It is in the public interest to assist welfare
4 recipients to attain economic self-sufficiency, thus saving
5 taxpayers money.

6 (b) Declarations.--Therefore, it is the policy of this7 Commonwealth to:

8 (1) Wherever possible, make appropriate entry-level jobs 9 in State government available to recipients of cash welfare 10 assistance, and provide the training and support services 11 needed by these individuals to successfully perform these 12 jobs.

13 (2) Where State-funded services are provided to Pennsylvania citizens through contractual or reimbursement 14 15 arrangements with third parties, encourage such service 16 providers to offer appropriate entry-level positions to 17 recipients of cash welfare assistance, and assist third-party 18 service providers to train assistance recipients for these 19 positions by granting funds to defray the cost of necessary 20 training and support services.

21 Section 2. Special efforts to recruit for entry-level 22 positions.

23 Each Executive Department of the Commonwealth shall review its work force on a monthly basis and identify all entry-level 24 25 positions. Each department shall notify the Department of Public Welfare when such vacancies occur and shall consider welfare 26 recipients along with other applicants for these positions. The 27 28 Department of Public Welfare shall immediately make all county boards of assistance aware of such vacancies and shall insure 29 30 that county boards of assistance post notice of the availability 19860H2036B2771 - 2 -

of such positions on a timely basis in a place which is readily
 accessible to applicants for and recipients of public
 assistance. The Civil Service Commission shall also notify the
 Department of Public Welfare when entry-level positions are
 available in the Commonwealth.

Section 3. Establishment of public service training program. 6 The Governor shall initiate a public service training program 7 which will prepare welfare recipients for entry-level positions 8 in State-operated facilities, including, but not limited to, 9 mental health facilities, State centers for the mentally 10 11 retarded, nursing homes, State general hospitals, youth facilities, correctional facilities, State-owned or operated 12 13 educational facilities, State parks and any other facility 14 operated by Commonwealth agencies.

15 Section 4. Human services employment and training pilot16 program.

(a) Establishment.--The Department of Public Welfare shall 17 18 establish a human services employment and training pilot program 19 by annually making available grants to State contractors and 20 other third-party providers of service receiving substantial 21 State funds, for the purpose of providing training and support 22 services to welfare recipients hired for entry-level positions. These grants may be made to hospitals, nursing homes, providers 23 24 of attendant care and homemaker services to the handicapped and 25 elderly, day-care centers, intermediate care facilities for the 26 mentally retarded, operators of community living arrangements 27 for the mentally retarded and mentally ill, and other applicable 28 service providers.

29 (b) Rules and regulations.--Within six months of the 30 effective date of this act, the department shall promulgate 19860H2036B2771 - 3 - 1 rules and regulations needed to implement this section.

(c) Reports to General Assembly.--On or before January 30,
1987, and each year thereafter, the Department of Public Welfare
shall submit a report on the human services employment and
training pilot program to the General Assembly which shall
include the following:

The names and addresses of all contractors who

received grant awards under the program.

9 (2) The amount of the grant awarded to each contractor. 10 (3) The number of welfare recipients receiving training 11 through each grant, the number of welfare recipients 12 completing the training and the number of trainees still 13 employed six months after completion of the training.

14 Section 5. Funding of the program.

(a) Appropriations.--The following funds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to carry out the provisions of this act during the fiscal year July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987:

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(1) To the Governor's Office:

20For creation of a public service training program for21welfare recipients.....\$165,000.

22 (2) To the Department of Public Welfare:

For creation of a human services employment and training pilot program to provide grants to State contractors and other third-party providers of service receiving substantial State funds for training welfare recipients.....\$1,000,000.

(b) Future appropriations.--Any general or Federal funds
provided for the program in subsequent fiscal years shall be
appropriated in the general appropriations acts for the fiscal
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- 1 years in amounts deemed appropriate by the General Assembly.
- 2 Section 6. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect July 1, 1986.
