AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
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5	Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
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7	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
8	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
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9 10	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12^{11}	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13^{12}	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14^{13}	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18	number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19	assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20	commissions shall be determined, " further providing for the
21	organization and operation of the State Transportation
22	Commission; and reestablishing the State Transportation
23	Commission in conformity with the Sunset Act.
24	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
25	hereby enacts as follows:
26	Section 1. Section 468 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
27	No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, amended May

28 6, 1970 (P.L.356, No.120) and October 4, 1978 (P.L.972, No.192),

2 Section 468. State Transportation Commission.--(a) There is 3 hereby created a State Transportation Commission which shall 4 consist of fifteen members, one of whom shall be the Secretary 5 of Transportation, ex officio, who shall be the chairman of the commission. The [chairman] majority and minority chairmen of the 6 7 Committee on [Highways] Transportation of the Senate and the 8 [chairman] majority and minority chairmen of the Committee on Transportation of the House of Representatives, respectively, 9 10 shall be [ex officio] members of the commission.

11 (b) [The] Subject to the provisions of subsection (h), the Governor shall nominate and by and with the advice and consent 12 13 of [two-thirds] <u>a majority</u> of all the members of the Senate, 14 appoint ten of the remaining members of the commission, not more 15 than five of whom shall be members of the same political party, 16 for terms of six years: Provided, That one of the two members 17 who is to be appointed by virtue of his membership on the board 18 of directors of a transportation authority shall be appointed 19 for an initial term of four years. Not more nor less than one 20 appointed member of the commission shall be a resident of the 21 counties of Philadelphia and Allegheny, respectively. At least one of the members of the commission shall hold at least a 22 23 private pilot's license and derive part of his or her livelihood from aviation related activities or be otherwise actively 24 involved in aviation. Effective with the first two appointments 25 26 after the adoption of this act at least two of the appointees of the Governor shall be members of the board of directors of a 27 28 transportation authority at the time of their appointment: 29 Provided, That said authority appointees shall not be considered 30 residents of either Philadelphia or Allegheny County for the 19860H2081B2839 - 2 -

purpose of the preceding sentence. The present members of the
 commission shall be entitled to complete their present terms and
 may be reappointed at the completion thereof.

4 (c) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker 5 of the House of Representatives shall each appoint one member of 6 the minority party in their respective houses to serve until 7 February 1, 1971. Subsequent appointees shall serve for two year periods ending on January 31, of the odd-numbered years or until 8 9 a successor is appointed whichever shall last occur. In the 10 event a member so appointed is no longer a member of the house 11 from which he was appointed, there shall be a vacancy in his position on the commission. Any member of the General Assembly 12 13 who serves as a member of the State Transportation Commission 14 pursuant to subsection (a) or this subsection shall have the 15 power and may appoint a designee who shall have the same rights 16 and privileges as a member when attending a meeting of the State Transportation Commission on behalf of the legislative member. 17 18 The members of the commission shall be reputable (d) 19 citizens of the Commonwealth, of mature judgment and broad 20 business experience and shall not hold any other position as an 21 employe of the Commonwealth. Any person appointed to fill a 22 vacancy shall serve only for the unexpired term. Any member of 23 the commission may be appointed to succeed himself. All 24 appointed members shall serve for their appointed terms and 25 until their successors have been appointed and qualify. <u>A member</u> 26 of the commission may be reappointed to succeed himself. All 27 appointed members shall serve for their appointed terms and may 28 serve for a period not to exceed six months until their 29 successors have been appointed and qualify. All vacancies shall 30 be filled not later than sixty days after such vacancy occurs. 19860H2081B2839 - 3 -

1 (e) No member of the commission, during his term of office shall directly or indirectly own, have any significant financial 2 3 interest in, be associated with, or receive any fee, commission, 4 compensation or anything of value from any person, firm, 5 partnership, business association or corporation which supplies materials or services of any nature except services of an 6 7 informational or advisory nature rendered as a public service and without profit to the Department of Transportation. 8

9 (f) Each member of the commission shall be deemed to have 10 been appointed to represent the interests of the Commonwealth at 11 large and shall not be deemed to be the representative of any 12 region or district whatsoever.

(g) The members of the commission, other than legislative members <u>during a legislative session</u>, shall be entitled to receive seventy-five dollars (\$75) per diem for each day actually spent in the performance of his duties and all members shall be entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses as determined by rule or regulation of the commission.

19 (h) Upon receipt of a written notice from the chairman of 20 the State Transportation Commission stating that the named member of the commission has missed three consecutive regularly 21 scheduled meetings of the commission without cause and excluding 22 23 any meetings under section 2011(c), (d) or (e), the appointing authority may remove the member named in the written notice and 24 25 may appoint a new member to fill the vacancy as provided in 26 subsection (d). 27 (i) The Department of Transportation shall supply all

30 Section 2. Section 2011(a) and (f) of the act, amended May 19860H2081B2839 - 4 -

1 6, 1970 (P.L.356, No.120), are amended to read:

2 Section 2011. State Transportation Commission.--(a) The 3 commission shall hold [regular] at least four regularly 4 scheduled meetings throughout the State, as may be determined 5 and announced in the January meeting, which meetings shall be open to the public at all times. At least two of these regularly 6 scheduled meetings shall be held in different geographical 7 regions of the State. Hearings for purposes of revising the 8 9 twelve-year plan shall not count against the four regularly scheduled meetings. The members shall meet at the call of the 10 11 Secretary of Transportation at the State Capitol during the month of January, or as soon thereafter as possible, to organize 12 13 as the State Transportation Commission. The commission shall 14 biennially elect a secretary who shall be a member of said commission. 15

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17 (f) The commission may adopt by laws to govern the conduct of 18 its affairs. The commission shall promulgate regulations not 19 inconsistent with provisions of this section for the execution of the powers and duties herein delegated to them. 20 21 Section 3. This act, with respect to the State 22 Transportation Commission, constitutes the legislation required 23 to reestablish an agency under the act of December 22, 1981 (P.L.508, No.142), known as the Sunset Act. 24 25 Section 4. This act shall take effect April 30, 1986.

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
