AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 5 and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," further providing for absentee ballots. 11
- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 13
- 14 Section 1. Section 102(w)(12) of the act of June 3, 1937
- 15 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,
- amended August 13, 1963 (P.L.707, No.379), is amended and the 16
- 17 clause is amended by adding subclauses to read:
- 18 Section 102. Definitions .-- The following words, when used in
- this act, shall have the following meanings, unless otherwise 19
- 20 clearly apparent from the context:

- 2 (w) The words "qualified absentee elector" shall mean:
- 3 * * *
- 4 (12) Any qualified, registered and enrolled elector who is a
- 5 spouse or dependent accompanying a person employed in the
- 6 service of this Commonwealth or in the service of the Federal
- 7 Government within the territorial limits of the several States
- 8 of the United States and the District of Columbia in the event
- 9 the duties, profession or occupation of such person require him
- 10 to be absent from the Commonwealth or county of his
- 11 residence[:]; or
- 12 (13) Any qualified elector who is a county employe who
- 13 cannot vote due to election day duties; or
- 14 (14) Any qualified elector who will not attend a polling
- 15 place because of the observance of a religious holiday:

- 17 Section 2. Section 1301(1) of the act, amended August 13,
- 18 1963 (P.L.707, No.379), is amended and the section is amended by
- 19 adding subsections to read:
- 20 Section 1301. Qualified Absentee Electors.--The following
- 21 persons shall be entitled to vote by an official absentee ballot
- 22 in any primary or election held in this Commonwealth in the
- 23 manner hereinafter provided:
- 24 * * *
- 25 (1) Any qualified registered and enrolled elector who is a
- 26 spouse or dependent accompanying a person employed in the
- 27 service of this Commonwealth or in the service of the Federal
- 28 Government within the territorial limits of the several States
- 29 of the United States and the District of Columbia in the event
- 30 the duties, profession or occupation of such person require him

- 1 to be absent from the Commonwealth or county of his
- 2 residence[:]; or
- 3 (m) Any qualified elector who is a county employe who cannot
- 4 vote due to election day duties; or
- 5 (n) Any qualified elector who will not attend a polling
- 6 place because of the observance of a religious holiday:

- 8 Section 3. Section 1302(e), (e.2) and (i) of the act, added
- 9 or amended December 2, 1976 (P.L.1221, No.269) and May 7, 1982
- 10 (P.L.393, No.114), are amended to read:
- 11 Section 1302. Applications for Official Absentee Ballots.--*
- 12 * *
- 13 (e) Any qualified bedridden or hospitalized veteran absent
- 14 from the State or county of his residence and unable to attend
- 15 his polling place because of such illness or physical
- 16 disability, regardless of whether he is registered or enrolled,
- 17 may apply at any time before any primary or election for an
- 18 official absentee ballot on any official county board of
- 19 election form addressed to the Secretary of the Commonwealth of
- 20 Pennsylvania or the county board of elections of the county in
- 21 which his voting residence is located.
- 22 The application shall contain the following information:
- 23 Residence at the time of becoming bedridden or hospitalized,
- 24 length of time a citizen, length of residence in Pennsylvania,
- 25 date of birth, length of time a resident in voting district,
- 26 voting district if known, party choice in case of primary, name
- 27 and address of present residence or hospital at which
- 28 hospitalized. When such application is received by the Secretary
- 29 of the Commonwealth, it shall be forwarded to the proper county
- 30 board of elections.

- 1 The application for an official absentee ballot for any
- 2 primary or election shall be made on information supplied over
- 3 the signature of the bedridden or hospitalized veteran as
- 4 required in the preceding subsection. Any qualified registered
- 5 elector, including a spouse or dependent referred to in
- 6 subsection (1) of section 1301, who expects to be or is absent
- 7 from the Commonwealth or county of his residence because his
- 8 duties, occupation or business require him to be elsewhere on
- 9 the day of any primary or election and any qualified registered
- 10 elector who is unable to attend his polling place on the day of
- 11 any primary or election because of illness or physical
- 12 disability and any qualified registered bedridden or
- 13 hospitalized veteran in the county of residence, or in the case
- 14 of a county employe who cannot vote due to election day duties,
- 15 or in the case of a person who will not attend a polling place
- 16 <u>because of the observance of a religious holiday</u>, may apply to
- 17 the county board of elections of the county in which his voting
- 18 residence is located for an Official Absentee Ballot. Such
- 19 application shall be made upon an official application form
- 20 supplied by the county board of elections. Such official
- 21 application form shall be determined and prescribed by the
- 22 Secretary of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 23 (1) The application of any qualified registered elector,
- 24 including spouse or dependent referred to in subsection (1) of
- 25 section 1301, who expects to be or is absent from the
- 26 Commonwealth or county of his residence because his duties,
- 27 occupation or business require him to be elsewhere on the day of
- 28 any primary or election, or in the case of a county employe who
- 29 cannot vote due to election day duties, or in the case of a
- 30 person who will not attend a polling place because of the

- 1 observance of a religious holiday, shall be signed by the
- 2 applicant and shall include the surname and [christian] given
- 3 name or names of the applicant, his occupation, date of birth,
- 4 length of time a resident in voting district, voting district if
- 5 known, place of residence, post office address to which ballot
- 6 is to be mailed, the reason for his absence, and such other
- 7 information as shall make clear to the county board of elections
- 8 the applicant's right to an official absentee ballot.
- 9 (2) The application of any qualified registered elector who
- 10 is unable to attend his polling place on the day of any primary
- 11 or election because of illness or physical disability and the
- 12 application of any qualified registered bedridden or
- 13 hospitalized veteran in the county of residence shall be signed
- 14 by the applicant and shall include surname and [christian] given
- 15 name or names of the applicant, his occupation, date of birth,
- 16 residence at the time of becoming bedridden or hospitalized,
- 17 length of time a resident in voting district, voting district if
- 18 known, place of residence, post office address to which ballot
- 19 is to be mailed, and such other information as shall make clear
- 20 to the county board of elections the applicant's right to an
- 21 official ballot. In addition, the application of such electors
- 22 shall include a declaration stating the nature of their
- 23 disability or illness, and the name, office address and office
- 24 telephone number of their attending physician: Provided,
- 25 however, That in the event any elector entitled to an absentee
- 26 ballot under this subsection be unable to sign his application
- 27 because of illness or physical disability, he shall be excused
- 28 from signing upon making a statement which shall be witnessed by
- 29 one adult person in substantially the following form: I hereby
- 30 state that I am unable to sign my application for an absentee

ballot without assistance because I am unable to write by reason 1 of my illness or physical disability. I have made or have 2 3 received assistance in making my mark in lieu of my signature. 4(Mark) 5 (Date) 6 7 (Complete Address of Witness) (Signature of Witness) * * * 8 (e.2) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this act any 9 10 qualified elector who expects to be or is absent from the 11 Commonwealth or county of his residence because his duties, 12 occupation or business require him to be elsewhere on the day of 13 any election or a county employe who cannot vote due to election 14 day duties or a person who will not attend a polling place 15 because of the observance of a religious holiday may make an 16 application for an absentee ballot by mail by sending a letter to the county board of elections in the county in which his 17 18 voting residence is located. The letter shall be signed by the 19 applicant and contain his name and place of residence. * * * 20 (i) Application for official absentee ballots shall be on 21 22 forms prescribed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth. The application shall state that a voter who receives an absentee 23 ballot [because of illness or absence from the district] 24 25 pursuant to section 1301 and who, on election day, is capable of voting at the appropriate polling place must void the absentee 26 27 ballot and vote in the normal manner at the appropriate voting place. Such forms shall be made freely available to the public 28 at county board of elections, municipal buildings and at such 29 other locations designated by the secretary. No written

- 2 the application forms. Copies of all completed applications for
- 3 official absentee ballots shall be retained by the county board
- 4 of elections.

- 7 Section 1303. Official Absentee Voters Ballots.--* * *
- 8 (e) The official absentee voter ballot shall state that a
- 9 voter who receives an absentee ballot [because of illness or
- 10 absence from the district] pursuant to section 1301 and who, on
- 11 election day, is capable of voting at the appropriate polling
- 12 place must void the absentee ballot and vote in the normal
- 13 manner at the appropriate voting place.
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
