#### INTRODUCED BY DEAL, MAY 28, 1985

#### A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4	Providing for a select committee to investigate the actions of the City of Philadelphia in the attempt to apprehend members of an organization known as MOVE in a house in West Philadelphia.
5	WHEREAS, Pursuant to the issuance of warrants and subsequent
б	to complaints from residents of West Philadelphia that members
7	of an organization known as MOVE were posing a severe threat to
8	public health and safety, the City of Philadelphia attempted to
9	apprehend members of MOVE; and
10	WHEREAS, A Pennsylvania State Police helicopter, working in
11	conjunction with the Philadelphia Police Department, dropped an
12	explosive device on a Philadelphia house occupied by members of
13	MOVE; and
14	WHEREAS, As a result of this incident, four children were
15	among the 11 persons killed; and
16	WHEREAS, During this incident, 61 houses were burned to the
17	ground, leaving innocent victims without property and homes; and
18	WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has the responsibility to protect

1 its citizens from such catastrophic incidents; and

2 WHEREAS, It is important that all aspects of this incident be 3 investigated to determine the cause of the incident, the manner 4 in which those in authority responded, how to prevent a 5 recurrence, and what can be done to aid the innocent victims; 6 therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives 8 appoint a select committee to investigate the actions of the City of Philadelphia in the attempt to apprehend members of an 9 10 organization known as MOVE in a house in West Philadelphia. The committee shall consist of seven members, four from the majority 11 12 party and three from the minority party; and be it further 13 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take 14 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems 15 necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the committee 16 shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to 17 witnesses appearing before the committee; and be it further 18 RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and 19 recommendations to the House of Representatives as soon as 20 possible.
