A RESOLUTION

Proclaiming April 24, 1986, as National Day of Remembrance for 1 Victims of Genocide. 2 3 WHEREAS, In 1915, the Armenian Genocide was conceived and 4 carried out against the Armenian people for eight years by the 5 Turkish government, resulting in the extermination of one and one-half million Armenian men, women and children and the 6 7 deportation of five hundred thousand survivors; and 8 WHEREAS, The organized governmental practice of the first 9 genocide of the 20th Century on the Armenian race was frequently 10 used by Nazi leaders in planning and supporting their genocide 11 campaigns during World War II; and 12 WHEREAS, The United States Holocaust Memorial Council 13 unanimously included the Armenian Genocide in the Holocaust 14 Museum Memorial; and 15 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should continually 16 rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all 17 people; and

1 WHEREAS, Failure of all of us to recognize and appreciate the 2 potential for man's inhumanity to man will only condemn us to 3 continue repeating the atrocities, horrors and tragedies of the 4 past; therefore be it

5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania declare that, in memory of the 6 Victims of Genocide, and in the hope that the citizens of this 7 8 Commonwealth will strive to overcome prejudice and inhumanity, April 24, 1986, will be declared as National Day of Remembrance 9 10 for Victims of Genocide; and be it further RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to 11 12 Mr. James Hagopian, Chairman of the Philadelphia Chapter,

13 Armenian National Committee, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
