AN ACT

Amending the act of May 17, 1956 (1955 P.L.1609, No.537), entitled "An act to promote the welfare of the people of the 3 Commonwealth by the reduction of unemployment in certain areas of the Commonwealth determined to be critical economic areas; providing for the establishment of industrial development projects in such areas; creating The Pennsylvania 6 7 Industrial Development Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to allocate funds for and make secured 9 loans to industrial development agencies for the payment of a part of the cost of industrial development projects in 10 critical economic areas; authorizing the Authority to enter 11 12 into agreements with the Government of the United States or 13 any Federal agency or industrial development agency; 14 empowering the Authority to take title to, sell, convey and 15 lease industrial development projects where necessary to protect loans made by the Pennsylvania Industrial Development 16 Authority on industrial development projects; providing that 17 18 no debt of the Commonwealth, its municipalities or political 19 subdivisions shall be incurred in the exercise of any powers 20 granted by this act; and providing for the examination of the accounts and affairs of the Authority; and making an 21 22 appropriation, " providing preferential Pennsylvania 23 Industrial Development Authority loans for the use of coal 24 produced in Pennsylvania.

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 26 hereby enacts as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The act of May 17, 1956 (1955 P.L.1609, No.537),
- 2 known as the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority Act,
- 3 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 4 <u>Section 6.1. Powers of the Authority; Encouragement of Use</u>
- 5 of Pennsylvania Produced Coal. -- (a) Whenever the board of the
- 6 Authority grants a loan for an industrial development project
- 7 involving:
- 8 (1) the construction of a facility which would burn coal
- 9 <u>either to heat the facility or as part of the industrial process</u>
- 10 carried out in the facility;
- 11 (2) the expansion of a facility which would burn coal either
- 12 to heat the expanded portion of the facility or as part of the
- 13 <u>industrial process carried out in the expanded portion of the</u>
- 14 facility; or
- 15 (3) the renovation of a facility which, because of the
- 16 renovation, would burn coal either to heat the renovated
- 17 <u>facility or as part of the industrial process carried out in the</u>
- 18 renovated facility, the interest rate on such loan shall not
- 19 exceed the lowest interest rate established by the board for any
- 20 <u>other loans, applicants or industrial development projects.</u>
- 21 (b) For the purpose of this section "coal" means coal
- 22 produced from mines in Pennsylvania or any mixture or synthetic
- 23 <u>derived in whole or in part from coal produced from mines in</u>
- 24 Pennsylvania.
- 25 (c) For the purposes of this section, the phrase "mixture"
- 26 <u>derived in whole or in part from coal" includes, but is not</u>
- 27 limited to, both the intermittent and the simultaneous burning
- 28 of natural gas with coal or a coal derivative if the
- 29 <u>intermittent or simultaneous burning of natural gas would:</u>
- 30 (1) lower the cost of using coal or a coal derivative

- produced from mines in Pennsylvania; or 1
- 2 (2) enable coal or a coal derivative produced from mines in
- 3 Pennsylvania to be burned in compliance with present and
- 4 reasonably anticipated environmental laws and regulations.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
