AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the issuance of commemorative front plates in honor of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding sections to read: § 1348. Bicentennial of the United States Constitution
commemorative plates.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person, the department shall issue a commemorative front plate in honor of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution. The plate shall have a blue background and bear such gold designs and characters, including the dates 1787-1987, as the department may determine to be appropriate.
(b) Display.--A commemorative plate in honor of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution may be displayed only on the front of a vehicle, and shall not constitute a registration plate.
(c) Duty of department.--The department shall publicize the availability of commemorative front plates in honor of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution and shall include promotional material and applications for such plates with renewal notices for registration plates for the year 1987 and thereafter as it may deem appropriate. § 1961. Bicentennial of the United States Constitution commemorative plates.

The fee for issuance of a commemorative front plate in honor of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution shall be $\$ 10$.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
