- 1 § 7401. Short title of chapter.
- 2 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
- 3 Automotive Dismantlers and Parts Recyclers Licensing Law.
- 4 § 7402. Definitions.
- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 8 "Automotive dismantler and parts recycler." A person engaged
- 9 in the business of purchasing and dismantling, disassembling or
- 10 repairing wrecked, abandoned or repairable motor vehicles, and
- 11 selling the usable parts, selling wrecked, abandoned or
- 12 repairable motor vehicles as a unit at wholesale or selling
- 13 repaired motor vehicles as a unit at wholesale. The term does
- 14 not apply to any person who, for a hobby and not for profit, has
- 15 inoperable vehicles which, upon restoration, are capable of
- 16 being registered as antique or classic vehicles.
- 17 "Salvage pool or salvage disposal sale." A scheduled sale at
- 18 auction or by private bid of wrecked or repairable motor
- 19 vehicles by insurance underwriters or dealers, either at retail
- 20 or wholesale.
- 21 SUBCHAPTER B
- 22 LICENSURE
- 23 Sec.
- 24 7411. Licensure of automobile dismantler and parts recycler.
- 25 7412. Requirement to maintain records.
- 26 7413. Transfer of automobile to dismantler and parts recycler.
- 27 7414. Refusal, cancellation or revocation of license.
- 28 § 7411. Licensure of automobile dismantler and parts recycler.
- 29 (a) General rule. -- No person, unless licensed by the
- 30 department, shall engage in the business of an automobile

- 1 dismantler and parts recycler.
- 2 (b) Application for license. -- A person desiring to engage in
- 3 the business of an automotive dismantler and parts recycler
- 4 shall apply, in writing, to the department on a form prescribed
- 5 by the department. The form shall contain:
- 6 (1) The name of the applicant.
- 7 (2) The street address of the applicant's established
- 8 place of business.
- 9 (3) A statement that the applicant's established place
- of business and all other facilities meet the requirements of
- 11 the act of December 15, 1971 (P.L.596, No.160), known as the
- Outdoor Advertising Control Act of 1971, where applicable,
- and the regulations promulgated by the department.
- 14 (4) The type of business organization of applicant.
- 15 (5) The applicant's sales tax number.
- 16 (6) Any additional information that may be required by
- 17 the department.
- 18 (c) Fee.--An application for a license to operate as an
- 19 automotive dismantler and parts recycler shall be accompanied by
- 20 a fee of \$150 to be collected by the department. If the
- 21 applicant possesses a valid license under section 3 of the act
- 22 of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.91, No.4), referred to as
- 23 the Junkyard and Automotive Recycler Screening Law, the
- 24 application fee shall be \$50.
- 25 (d) Bond required. -- Before approving a license application,
- 26 the department shall require the applicant to furnish and
- 27 maintain a bond indemnifying the public and the department in
- 28 the amount of \$10,000. An individual bond for each place of
- 29 business is not required, but all places of business shall be
- 30 covered by the bond.

- 1 (e) Duration and renewal.--Licenses shall be issued for a
- 2 period of one year and shall be subject to annual renewal.
- 3 § 7412. Requirement to maintain records.
- 4 An automotive dismantler and parts recycler shall keep a
- 5 register of all purchases and sales of motor vehicles for five
- 6 years from the date of purchase or sale, showing make, model,
- 7 year, body style, vehicle identification number and name and
- 8 address of the purchaser or seller. Owners of salvage pools
- 9 shall furnish the purchaser with the make, model, year, body
- 10 style and vehicle identification number of the vehicles they
- 11 sell, and, if the owner is an insurance company, the insurance
- 12 company shall furnish the purchaser with the claim number. The
- 13 registers shall be made available for inspection during business
- 14 hours by law enforcement officers of the state, county and
- 15 municipality in which the automotive dismantler and parts
- 16 recycler's business is located.
- 17 § 7413. Transfer of automobile to dismantler and parts
- 18 recycler.
- 19 When a licensed automobile dismantler and recycler obtains a
- 20 destroyed or junked vehicle from a licensed salvor, it is the
- 21 duty of the salvor to obtain a certificate of junk for the
- 22 vehicle. When a licensed automobile dismantler and parts
- 23 recycler purchases a destroyed or junked vehicle from a person
- 24 other than a salvor, it is the duty of the automobile dismantler
- 25 and parts recycler to obtain the certificate of junk.
- 26 Application for the certificate of junk shall be in accordance
- 27 with the requirements of section 1117 (relating to vehicle
- 28 destroyed or junked).
- 29 § 7414. Refusal, cancellation or revocation of license.
- 30 (a) General rule.--The department is authorized to refuse a

- 1 license to any person who does not meet the requirements of this
- 2 chapter and department regulations, and to cancel the license of
- 3 any licensee for willful failure to continue to meet the
- 4 requirements of this chapter and department regulations. The
- 5 department is authorized to refuse, cancel or revoke a license
- 6 if the applicant or licensee has been convicted of a violation
- 7 of a State or Federal law involving theft or has been convicted
- 8 of a violation of any of the provisions of Chapter 71 (relating
- 9 to vehicle theft and related provisions) or similar laws of
- 10 other states.
- 11 (b) Notice.--A person who is refused a license or whose
- 12 license is canceled or revoked shall be notified in person or by
- 13 certified mail sent to the address given on the application of
- 14 the applicant or licensee.
- 15 (d) Definition.--As used in this section the term "applicant
- 16 or licensee" includes a partner of an applicant or licensee, or
- 17 a director, officer or manager of a corporate applicant or
- 18 licensee.

- 20 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 22 7421. Salvage pools or salvage disposal sales.
- 23 7422. Salvage dealers licensed in other states.
- 24 7423. Penalty.
- 25 7424. Injunction.
- 26 § 7421. Salvage pools or salvage disposal sales.
- 27 (a) General rule.--Sales at a salvage pool or a salvage
- 28 disposal sale shall be open only to persons holding a current
- 29 automotive dismantler and parts recycler license and their
- 30 agents or employees. The persons must have a separate buyer's

- 1 identification card to buy at a salvage pool or salvage disposal
- 2 sale.
- 3 (b) Application for buyer's identification card.--A person
- 4 desiring to purchase a buyer's identification card may do so by
- 5 making application to the department, upon a form prescribed by
- 6 the department. The form shall contain:
- 7 (1) The name of the applicant.
- 8 (2) The street address of the applicant's established
- 9 place of business.
- 10 (3) If an agent or employee, the name of the licensee
- for whom the applicant will be making purchases at salvage
- 12 pools or salvage disposal sales.
- 13 (4) The license number under which the applicant will be
- 14 making purchases.
- 15 (5) Any other information that may be required by the
- 16 department.
- 17 (c) Qualifications for holder of buyer's identification
- 18 card. -- In order to obtain a buyer's identification card, a
- 19 person must:
- 20 (1) Be a licensed automotive dismantler and parts
- 21 recycler or an agent or employee of a licensed automotive
- 22 dismantler and parts recycler.
- 23 (2) Pay a fee of \$15 to the department for processing
- the buyer's identification card.
- 25 (d) Use of card.--The card shall be valid as long as the
- 26 holder is a licensed automotive dismantler and parts recycler or
- 27 an agent or employee of the same licensed automotive dismantler
- 28 and parts recycler at the time the card is issued. Buyer's
- 29 identification cards are not transferable. If the holder ceases
- 30 to be a licensed automotive dismantler and parts recycler or an

- 1 agent or employee of a licensed automotive dismantler and parts
- 2 recycler, then the card shall be invalid and it is the duty of
- 3 the holder to return the card to the department.
- 4 (e) Limitation on number of agents or employees.--A licensee
- 5 may not have more than three agents or employees who are holders
- 6 of a buyer's identification card.
- 7 (f) Penalty.--It is unlawful for the owner, manager or
- 8 person in charge of a salvage pool or salvage disposal sale to
- 9 permit the bidding by a person who does not possess a valid
- 10 buyer's identification card at a sale. A person who violates
- 11 this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 12 § 7422. Salvage dealers licensed in other states.
- 13 Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit salvage dealers
- 14 licensed in other states from buying at a salvage pool or
- 15 salvage disposal sale provided they qualify under this chapter
- 16 as a holder of a buyer's identification card.
- 17 § 7423. Penalty.
- 18 A person who violates this chapter, with the exception of
- 19 section 7421(f) (relating to salvage pools or salvage disposal
- 20 sales), commits a summary offense.
- 21 § 7424. Injunction.
- 22 The district attorney of a county in which a violation of
- 23 this chapter occurs may seek injunctive relief in the court of
- 24 common pleas to prohibit continued violations of this chapter by
- 25 any person.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
