18	Section 303. Classes of Income(a) The classes of income
19	referred to above are as follows:
20	(1) Compensation. All salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses
21	and incentive payments whether based on profits or otherwise,
22	fees, tips and similar remuneration received for services

rendered whether directly or through an agent and whether in 1 2 cash or in property except income derived from the United States 3 Government for active duty outside the Commonwealth of 4 Pennsylvania as a member of its armed forces. <u>Notwithstanding</u> 5 the foregoing, an amount equal to any expenses incurred by a person for work as a volunteer firefighter, ambulance or rescue 6 7 squad member shall be excluded from income taxed as 8 compensation. 9 * * * 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1989.
