RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives

- 1 direct the Committee on Conservation to hold hearings to
- 2 determine the safety and environmental impacts of mass burn
- 3 incinerators and the possible need for further regulation of
- 4 such incinerators; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings within [90
- 6 days] one year to the House of Representatives.
