## A RESOLUTION

Providing for the appointment of a select committee to study autism in this Commonwealth, focusing primarily on the availability, or lack thereof, of services to autistic children.

WHEREAS, Fifteen of every 10,000 children in this
Commonwealth have autism; and
WHEREAS, Autism is a condition which severely impairs
development, mentally, emotionally and socially; and
WHEREAS, There are few services available to these children
who are affected by autism; and
WHEREAS, It is important for the Commonwealth to determine the extent of the problem and what can be done about it;
therefore be it
RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoint a select committee of nine members, five from the majority party and four from the minority party, to conduct a
study of autism in this Commonwealth; and be it further RESOLVED, That the committee focus on the services available and the services needed for autistic children; and be it further RESOLVED, That in carrying out its duties, the select committee may exercise all powers permitted to be exercised by standing committees as provided for in the Rules of the House of Representatives; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the select committee may hold hearings, take testimony and make its investigations at such places at it deems necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the select committee shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses appearing before the committee; and be it further RESOLVED, That the select committee make a report of its findings and recommendations to the House of Representatives as soon as possible.
