## A RESOLUTION

5	WHEREAS, The Office of Employment Security of the Department
б	of Labor and Industry has closed many itinerant points
7	throughout the Commonwealth which provided services to
8	unemployed persons in less populated areas; and
9	WHEREAS, The closing of these local offices has caused a
10	hardship on the persons formerly served by them; and
11	WHEREAS, Many letters and petitions have been received urging
12	that the itinerant points be reopened; and
13	WHEREAS, The Office of Employment Security has nonetheless
14	refused to reopen the itinerant points; therefore be it
15	RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
16	Chairman of the House Labor Relations Committee to appoint an ad
17	hoc subcommittee to investigate the closing of itinerant points

by the Office of Employment Security to determine whether the
closings are in the best interest of the Commonwealth; and be it
further

4 RESOLVED, That the subcommittee may hold hearings, take 5 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems 6 necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the subcommittee 7 shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to 8 witnesses appearing before the subcommittee; and be it further 9 RESOLVED, That the subcommittee make a report of its findings 10 and recommendations to the House of Representatives as soon as 11 practicable.
